Head Coach Paul Engelhardt

Paul Engelhardt is set to begin his third season as just the fifth head coach of the Moravian College baseball program since the school began the sport in 1935.

Engelhardt has posted a 33-41 record in his first two seasons after five years as an assistant coach at Lafayette College where he served as the Leopards third base coach, hitting instructor and defensive catchers and outfield coach.

Engelhardt was also assistant coach at Muhlenberg College for one season in 2000-01. His other local coaching experience includes a year and a half as assistant head coach of the Freemansburg Senior Legion team and five seasons as head coach of the Lower Nazareth Phillies of the Blue Mountain League (1998-2002).

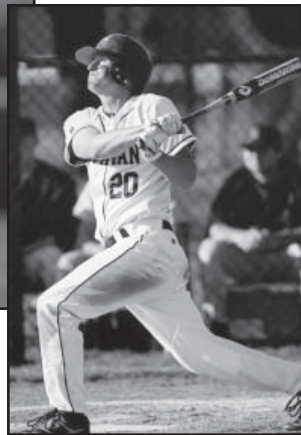
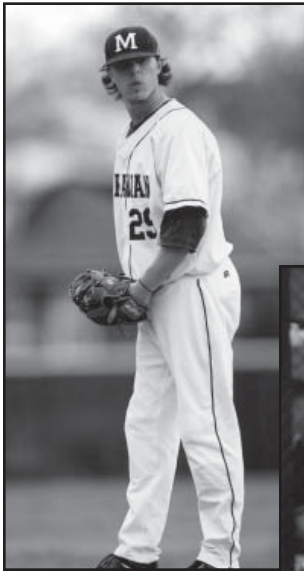
Engelhardt earned a Bachelors of Science in Psychology with minors in business, legal studies and political sciences from the University of Pittsburgh in 1996.

2009 Season Preview

The Moravian College baseball team looks to make a return to the conference playoffs in 2009 in the second year of the Landmark Conference with the return of eight starters and 20 letterwinners. Third year head coach **Paul Engelhardt** expects the squad to make it all the way to the conference finals and challenge for a bid to the NCAA Regional Tournament.

Leading the Greyhounds will be senior **Joseph Durso (Middletown, NJ/Christian Brother Academy)**, who had a .407 batting average to go along with 50 hits, 10 doubles, one home run, 26 RBIs, nine walks and four stolen bases. **Durso** became the second player in school history to collect 50 hits in a single season and the 14th player to get to 100 career hits. He is currently ninth with 115 hits heading into his senior season.

Senior outfielder **Eric Shea (Madison, NJ/Morristown Beard HS)** contributed a .333 average off of 35 hits, two doubles, two triples, one home run, 13 RBIs, 13 walks and a team leading 14 stolen bases.

Junior **Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS)** posted a .316 batting average with 30 hits, three doubles, one triple, one home run, 17 RBIs, and six stolen bases last season while senior **Kevin Gambrino (Brick, NJ/Monsignor Donovan HS)** had 25 hits, four doubles, 25 RBIs, four stolen bases and a team leading two home runs.

Senior **Thomas Czarnecki (Columbia, NJ/North Warren HS)** had 12 hits, three doubles, one triple and 12 RBIs while sophomore **Jake Schweitzer (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** knocked in five RBIs off of one homer, one triple, three doubles and 19 hits last season. Schweitzer also tossed 10 1/3 innings with a save, eight strikeouts and six walks.

Sophomore **Jason Huber (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** had 19 hits, five doubles and 12 RBIs. Junior **Andrew DeLio (Parsippany, NJ/Parsippany HS)** connected for seven hits and four RBIs and tossed 11 2/3 innings with 11 strikeouts and six walks.

Leading the pitchers for Moravian is junior **Christopher Morrison (Middlesex, NJ/Immaculata HS)**, who had a 3.64 ERA and a 5-3 record to go along with 40 hits, 18 walks, 30 strike outs, and three complete games in 42 innings pitched. **Morrison** was named to the 2008 Landmark All-Conference Second Team and this past summer he spent his second season pitching for the Lehigh Valley Catz in the ACBL wooden bat league.

Junior **Joe Melchionna (Marlboro, NJ/St. John Vianney HS)** had a 5.17 ERA and a 5-3 record with 53 hits, eight walks, 30 strike outs and one save in 47 innings pitched. Junior **Brandon Palmisano (Mountainhome, PA/Pius X HS)** had a 2-3 mark with two saves, a 4.67 ERA, 28 strikeouts and ten walks in 27 innings.

Junior **Andrew DelRossi (Medford, NJ/Bishop Eustace HS)** contributed a 1-1 record including four walks and four strike outs in 11 1/3 innings pitched while sophomore **Luke Skutches (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** had a 1-0 record off of nine walks and seven strike outs in ten innings of action.

Coach **Engelhardt** has a strong recruiting class coming to the Moravian campus including recruits from Texas, Florida and Virginia and expects them to make an immediate impact in the 2009 season. He has 11 players joining the program with eight position players and three pitchers.

The Greyhounds begin their 2009 season in the Floyd B. Wilcox Memorial Tournament at Hampden-Sydney College, Virginia and then begin the Landmark Conference season on Saturday, March 14th when they face off against Susquehanna University.

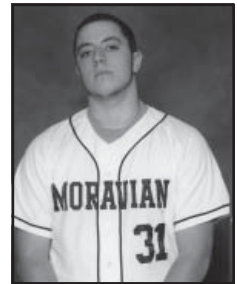
