Moravian College is a private, selective liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley, in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Steel Field athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

Head Coach Welles Lobb

Welles Lobb is beginning his third year as Moravian College's head men's and women's cross country coach. **Lobb** led the women's team to a runner-up finish in the inaugural Landmark Conference Championships in 2007.

Lobb also serves as an assistant coach for the Greyhound indoor and outdoor track and field teams.

Lobb came to Moravian after 16 years as a coach at Muhlenberg College including one season as head coach after 15 years as an assistant beginning in 1990. He coached the first Muhlenberg student-athletes to reach the NCAA Division III Cross Country National Championships including three men and one woman.

Lobb was also assistant men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams at Muhlenberg including serving as head coach during 1992-1993.

Recently, **Lobb** earned his USATF Level I certification. He also served as an editor of *Runners World* Magazine from 1994 to 2001 and was a competitive distance runner for 34 years.

Lobb earned a Bachelors of Art in Geography from Mansfield University in 1978 and a Bachelors of Arts in English from Cedar Crest College in 2005.

2008 Season Preview

The 2008 Moravian College men's and women's cross country teams look to challenge for the Landmark Conference Championships with both squads returning a majority of their top runners including five letterwinners on the women's team and eight letterwinners on the men's team.

The cross country squads are going into the 2008 season with high hopes ahead of them as third-year head coach **Welles Lobb** looks into building his young teams up enough to be a top competitor in the Landmark Conference.

Leading the men's team is sophomore **Connor Skutches (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)**, who recorded his best time of the season, 26:38, at the 2007 NCAA Division III Mideast Regional where he placed 65th. Senior **Jeremiah Reinhart (Effort, PA/Pleasant Valley HS)** posted his best time of the 2007 season at the 34th annual Brooks Paul Short Run where he placed 38th out of 270 runners with a time of 27:03. **Reinhart** earned Landmark All-Conference First Team honors while **Skutches** earned Landmark All-Conference Second Team in 2007.

Junior **Steve Parisi (Kunkletown, PA/Pleasant Valley HS)** also set his best time at the 2007 NCAA Mideast Regional with a pace of 28:19. Junior **Steve DeFazio (Branchburg, NJ/Somerville HS)** and sophomore **Jesse Miller (Lewisburg, PA/Lewisburg HS)** both recorded their best times at the 2007 NCAA Mideast Regional as well with **DeFazio** recording a 28:30 time and **Miller** running a time of 29:14.

Also returning this year for the Greyhound are senior **John McCullough (Levittown, PA/Conwell-Egan HS)**, junior **Timothy Betz (Havertown, PA/Haverford HS)** and sophomore **Jacob Tazik (Wyomissing, PA/Wyomissing HS)**.

On the women's team, the top returning runner is senior **Kayla Teeling (Milford, NJ/Phillipsburg HS)**, who recorded her best time of the year at the 2007 NCAA Mideast Regional with a time of 23:05 in the 6,000-meter run where she placed 42nd out of 267 runners. **Teeling** posted a 19:39 in the 5,000-meter run at the Misericordia University Cougar Classic where she placed second overall. **Teeling** also earned First Team Landmark All-Conference honors last season.

Sophomore **Tara Chiarella (Hallstead, PA/Montrose Area HS)** ran her best time of 23:10 at the 2007 NCAA Mideast Regional where she placed 46th. **Chiarella** also earned First Team Landmark All-Conference to go along with being named the 2007 Landmark Conference Rookie of the Year.

Also running at the 2007 NCAA Mideast Regional were seniors **Stephanie Miller (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** and **Kelly Williams (Tafton, PA/Wallenpaupack HS)**, who ran times of 24:48 and 25:51 respectively.

Sophomore **Kaleen Holden (Scranton, PA/Bishop Hannan HS)** ran a time of 24:45 in the 6,000-meter run last year.

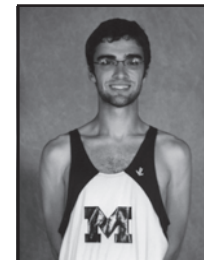
Coach **Lobb** has a strong recruiting class coming into this year for both the men and the women with several runners on both sides expected to make an immediate impact.

The Greyhounds will open the 2008 season on Friday, August 29th at the Lehigh Valley Games taking place at Lehigh University.

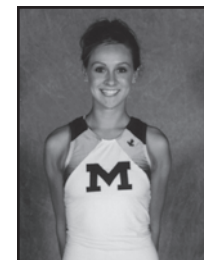
