Moravian College is a private, selective, liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 18 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2009-10 school year, Moravian teams won seven Landmark Conference championships with ten teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the baseball, women's basketball and softball teams. In addition, 13 student-athletes earned All-America status with three national champions in track & field.

Approximately one-quarter of Moravian's student body participates in intercollegiate athletics every year, and many more compete in club sports and intramurals. Moravian's student-athletes excel academically. The College has had 33 Academic All-Americans, while more than 70 student-athletes earn spots on the conference All-Academic Honor Rolls yearly.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Moravian College Steel Athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

Head Coach Amy Endler

Amy Endler enters her eighth season as Moravian's head field hockey coach. She is just the fifth coach in Moravian College history and led the 2004 team to a 10-8 record, tying the school record for victories in a season.

Endler, a 1993 graduate of Moravian, played one season of field hockey for the Greyhounds during her four years in Bethlehem, which included an outstanding basketball career. Endler was inducted into the Moravian College Hall of Fame in 2003.

In addition to her duties as head field hockey coach, Endler will be an assistant coach for the women's basketball team for the ninth straight year.

Prior to returning to Moravian in 2002, Endler spent ten years on the high school level. She was the head basketball and field hockey coach Roselle Park (NJ) High School. Endler led the Roselle Park field hockey squad from 1994 until 2001, leading the 1994 team to the Mountain Valley Conference Championship, and she was the head girl's basketball coach from 1996 until 2002.

Endler received her Master's Degree from Montclair State University and also graduated from the NCAA Women Coaches Academy in December 2007.

2010 Season Preview

The 2010 Moravian College field hockey team looks to move forward with the progression the team has posted over the last few years with five returning starters and 11 returning letterwinners back for the 2010 season under the direction of head coach Amy Endler. The Greyhounds are also looking forward to challenge for a Landmark Conference playoff berth.

Leading the Greyhounds' offense will be senior forwards Maureen Helfers (Westbury, NY/W.T. Clarke HS), Vita Ranella (Clarks Green, PA/Abington Heights HS) and Becky Renaldo (Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS). Helfers led the team a year ago with five assists, and she added a goal for seven points while Ranella had two goals and an assist for five points. Renaldo contributed a goal and an assist last season for three points.

Moravian has sophomore forward Brianna Van Buskirk (Stroudsburg, PA/Stroudsburg HS) and junior forward Royan Santiago (Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS) also returning.

Junior Erica Cernobyl (Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS) is back to anchor the Greyhounds' midfield after seeing action in all 18 matches last season.

Sophomore Stephanie Pezzello (Holmdel, NJ/St. John Vianney HS) will lead Moravian on the defensive end of the field, returning after making a team high six defensive saves last season while playing in every match and starting 16 as a freshman. Seniors Alexandra Lopez (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) and Lizzette Arias (Arlington, VA/Wakefield HS) also return on the defensive side of the field.

The Greyhounds do return three goalies this season led by senior Maura Acox (Old Bridge, NJ/St. John Vianney HS). Acox is a three-year starter, who posted a 1.73 goals-against average and a .724 save percentage last season. She made 71 saves to go with a 7-8 record and four shutouts in 1,093 minutes of action. Sophomore Kirsten Gehm (Phillipsburg, NJ/Phillipsburg HS) saw 45 minutes of action last year with a 3.13 goals-against average and five saves while sophomore Catherine Gottlieb (Blackwood, NJ/Paul VI HS) did not see action last fall.

Coach Endler has brought another strong recruiting class to Bethlehem and looks for the newcomers to make an immediate impact on the program.

The Greyhounds open their 2010 season on Wednesday, September 1st in a non-conference match at DeSales University. Moravian plays its first home contest on Saturday, September 4th when Marywood University comes to Bethlehem for a 1:00 p.m. match at Betty Prince Field. The 2010 Landmark Conference season will begin on Saturday, September 25th as the Greyhounds host Drew University at 1:00 p.m.
