

About Moravian College

Moravian College is a private, selective liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley, in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian College believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 20 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2007-08 school year, Moravian teams won six Landmark Conference championships, with 11 teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the women's soccer and men's basketball teams and ECAC Championships for the women's indoor and outdoor track & field squads and the men's outdoor track & field team. In addition, nine student-athletes earned All-America status including one *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-American and two national champions in track & field.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Steel Field athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

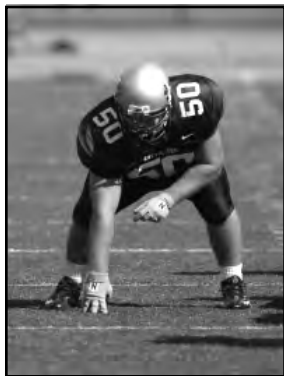

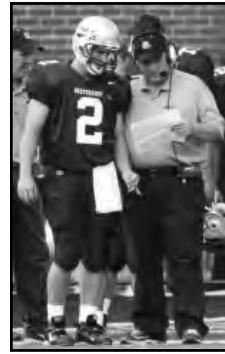

Head Coach Scot Dapp



The 21-year coaching tenure of **Scot Dapp** has been the most successful period in Moravian football annals: two trips to the NCAA Championship Tournament, including a berth in the 1988 South Region title game, Middle Atlantic Conference champions in 1988 and Commonwealth League champs in 1993, the school's first three berths in ECAC Championship games, playing in the Southeast game in 2002 and the Southwest game in 2004 and 2005 with a win in 2005, a string of 11 consecutive winning seasons—the longest streak in school history—in his first 11 years and a 21-year record of 127-88-1.

Dapp earned Coach-of-the-Year accolades from the MAC three times. He was the 1988 winner after leading the 'Hounds to a 9-1 regular season, then won the inaugural Commonwealth League honors in 1993, when Moravian won the first-ever Commonwealth crown. In 1997, he was named Co-Coach of the Year after leading the Greyhounds to a 7-3 overall record. The 1993 season also saw Dapp earn career win number 50, becoming just the second Moravian mentor to reach that mark. Dapp reached 100 career victories in 2002, and became Moravian's all-time victory leader in 2007 with his 123rd win. Dapp's .590 winning percentage ranks among the top 50 active NCAA Division III coaches.

Before coming to Moravian in 1987, Dapp served as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Division I-AA Delaware State College. He spent seven years at Susquehanna, where he coached defensive backs and linebackers and served as defensive coordinator. In 1983, Dapp helped the Crusaders to a ninth-place national ranking. He also was the head coach of Susquehanna's baseball team. Dapp's credentials also include two seasons as offensive backfield coach at Kutztown University.

A 1973 graduate of West Chester University (health and physical education), Dapp earned his master's degree in physical education from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He also is a National Athletic Trainers Association-certified trainer. Dapp is a professor of physical education at Moravian, and served as an assistant softball coach for 11 seasons.

In 2006, Dapp completed his term as President of the American Football Coaches Association, having been voted on the Board of Trustees in 1999. The AFCA was founded in 1922 and now has over 10,000 members. Coach Dapp was the 81st President of the Association and only the fifth Division III coach to hold that position in the 83 years of the organization.

Also in 2006, Dapp served as an assistant coach for the East squad at the annual Hula Bowl College All-Star game in Honolulu, Hawaii, and he received the John Whitehead Award at the Nike Coach of the Year Clinic for his contribution to the game of football.

In 2002, Dapp was recognized by the All-American Football Foundation with the John Vaught Lifetime Achievement Award for outstanding performance in the profession, and in 2007, Dapp was honored with the Outstanding Association President Award by the All-American Football Foundation.

2008 Season Preview

Moravian brings back all but one of its linebackers led by senior linebacker **Andrew Morrissey (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS)**, who paced the Greyhound defense with a team high 75 tackles to go along with six tackles for loss, a fumble recovery and four forced fumbles while earning a spot on the All-Centennial Conference Second Team. Senior linebacker **Kevin McGorry (Whitehall, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** added 74 tackles, eight tackles for loss, a sack, two pass break-ups, a fumble recovery and three forced fumbles while junior linebacker **Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS)** contributed 31 tackles with four tackles for loss, a sack and two forced fumbles. Junior **Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS)** made 33 tackles with three and a half tackles for loss, a half a sack, two pass break-ups, a fumble return of five yards and a blocked punt while sophomore linebacker **Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** made 20 tackles last season with one tackle for loss, one sack, two pass break-ups and a blocked punt.

In the defensive backfield, senior strong safety **Carl Robinson (Boothwyn, PA/Garnet Valley HS)** contributed 51 tackles, five interceptions and a forced fumble, and he earned All-Centennial Conference Honorable Mention accolades. Senior defensive back **Eric Brinkerhoff (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)** had 61 tackles with eight tackles for loss, four sacks, a fumble return of 72 yards for a touchdown, one interception, two forced fumbles and three pass break-ups while junior cornerback **Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS)** made 42 tackles with one for loss, ten pass break-ups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Sophomore cornerback **Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** had 33 tackles to go along with an interception and four pass break-ups while sophomore defensive back **Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS)** contributed 27 tackles, one tackle for loss, an interception and two pass break-ups for Moravian. Sophomore defensive back/linebacker **Jason Lauver (Winfield, PA/Selinsgrove HS)** had an interception, a fumble recovery and five tackles.

Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil (Branchburg, NJ/Somerville HS)** was 29-for-29 on extra-point attempts this season, and he was 11-for-20 on field goal attempts with a long of 37 yards while being named to the All-Centennial Conference Second Team. **Reckenbeil** averaged 52.8 yards per kickoff as well, making opponents receive the kickoff at their own 17-yard line. Senior punter **Michael Voskian (Brielle, NJ/Manasquan HS)** averaged 35.9 yards per punt on 49 attempts with a career long of 51 yards. **Voskian** had 11 punts inside the 20-yard line, eight fair caught, one blocked and five touchbacks.

McCambridge had six kickoff returns for 124 yards, and he also had six punt returns for 124 yards while **Alex Hersch** added nine kickoff returns for 206 yards and five special teams tackles. Sophomore defensive back **Eric Woodruff (Broadheadsville, PA/Pius X HS)**, who had eight tackles, five pass break-ups and a blocked extra-point, returned eight kickoffs for 165 yards while **Tyler Hersch** ran back 10 kickoffs for 247 yards.

During camp, coach **Dapp** will work in 35 new faces with the 68 returning players as the Greyhounds prepare for their second season of competition in the Centennial Conference.

2008 Season Preview

The Moravian College football team looks to challenge for the 2008 Centennial Conference Championship during its second season as an associate member of the league with the return of 17 starters and 68 letterwinners from last year's 6-4 team. The Greyhounds tied for fifth in their inaugural Centennial Conference season with a 4-4 mark, and two of the team's four losses in conference action were by less than a touchdown.

The Greyhounds, under the direction of head coach **Scot Dapp** in his 22nd season, will also play the same two non-conference opponents this season with the season opener at home versus Susquehanna University on September 6th and a road game at Lebanon Valley College on September 20th. Coach Dapp became the all-time winningest head coach in Moravian history a year ago with his 123rd career victory in Moravian's Centennial Conference opening win over McDaniel College.

Coach **Dapp** returns six starters on the offensive side of the ball and a wealth of experience. Senior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier (Center Valley, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** returns to lead the offense after completing 129 of 236 passes for 1,948 yards with 17 touchdowns and 10 interceptions while earning All-Centennial Conference First Team Honors. **Braxmeier** also had four rushing touchdowns.

Moravian's other two returning quarterbacks will move to different positions this fall with a group of newcomers to compete for the back-up position. Junior **Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS)** completed two of eight passes for 51 yards last fall. **Rempe**, who saw action as a tailback a year ago and will play tailback this season, had six carries for 23 yards while sophomore **Steven Zander (Newton, NJ/Newton HS)** added two rushing attempts for no yards and completed a pass for 15 yards last season and has moved to the receiving corps this year.

The Greyhounds also have tremendous depth in the backfield led by senior tailback **Tyler McCambridge (Northampton, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)**, who gained 483 yards on 122 carries this season with two touchdowns. Senior fullback **Morgan deRouen (West Milford, NJ/Milford HS)**, who earned All-Centennial Conference Honorable Mention honors last fall, had 399 yards and two touchdowns on 63 attempts while senior yards tailback **Tyler deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS)**, who missed the last six games with an injury, added 132 yards and a score. Sophomore running back **Ricky Allen (Pocono Summit, PA/Pocono Mountain West HS)** contributed 213 yards and a touchdown on 56 carries while junior running back **Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** had 183 yards and a touchdown on 59 rushing attempts with a long of ten yards.

The Greyhounds had 12 different players catch a pass last season and nine of those players return this fall. Sophomore wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS)** had 29 catches for 466 yards and three scores while senior wide receiver **Tyler Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** had 14 catches for 202 yards despite missing three games. Senior wide receiver **Tyler Williams (Coplay, PA/Whitehall HS)** had ten receptions for 114 yards and a touchdown while junior tight end **Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)** had 12 receptions for 149 yards. **Morgan deRouen** had five catches for 65 yards with one touchdown while **McCambridge** had four catches for 28 yards. Sophomore wide receiver **Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** contributed four receptions for 57 yards and two touchdowns while senior tight end **Nick Johnson (Keyport, NJ/Keyport HS)** had a catch for 41 yards.

Moravian does have to replace three starters on the offensive line; however, senior **Timothy McBride (Egg Harbor Township, NJ/Egg Harbor Township HS)** returns for his third season as a starter. Junior **Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS)** is the other returning starter on the offensive line while sophomore **Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** and senior **Wes Harpel (East Greenville, PA/Upper Perkiomen HS)** each have playing experience to step into the starting line-up.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Greyhounds bring back nine starters and are also deep with experienced players. Senior defensive end **Don Maxwell (Berkeley Heights, NJ/Governor Livingston HS)** led the Moravian defensive front with 39 tackles including two tackles for loss, half a sack and a fumble recovery while senior defensive lineman **Douglas Bocchino (Madison, NJ/Madison HS)** added 40 tackles, six tackles for loss, three sacks, an interception returned 45 yards for a touchdown, a pass break-up and a fumble recovery in the end zone for a touchdown. Both **Maxwell** and **Bocchino** were All-Centennial Conference Second Team selections last fall. Sophomore defensive lineman **Sean Rimmer (Kintnersville, PA/Palisades HS)** made 12 tackles with one tackle for loss while senior defensive tackle **Robert Kadel (Blairstown, NJ/North Warren HS)** had eight tackles with two tackles for loss.

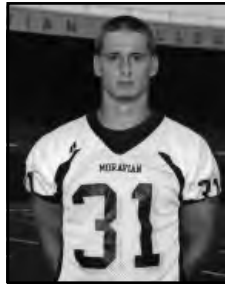
