

About Moravian College

Moravian College is a private, selective, liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian College believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 20 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2008-09 school year, Moravian teams won six Landmark Conference championships with 14 teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the women's soccer, women's basketball and softball teams and ECAC Championships for the men's and women's outdoor track & field teams. In addition, ten student-athletes earned All-America status, including one *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-American and one national champion in track & field.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Steel Field athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

Head Coach Scot Dapp



The 22-year coaching tenure of **Scot Dapp** has been the most successful period in Moravian football annals: two trips to the NCAA Championship Tournament, including a berth in the 1988 South Region title game, Middle Atlantic Conference champions in 1988, and Commonwealth League champs in 1993, the school's first four berths in ECAC Championship games, playing in the Southeast game in 2002 and the Southwest game in 2004, 2005 and 2008 with a win in 2005, a string of 11 consecutive winning seasons—the longest streak in school history—in his first 11 years and a 22-year record of 135-91-1.

Dapp earned Coach-of-the-Year accolades from the MAC three times. He was the 1988 winner after leading the 'Hounds to a 9-1 regular season, then won the inaugural Commonwealth League honors in 1993, when Moravian won the first-ever Commonwealth crown. In 1997, he was named Co-Coach of the Year after leading the Greyhounds to a 7-3 overall record. The 1993 season also saw Dapp earn career win number 50, becoming just the second Moravian mentor to reach that mark. Dapp

reached 100 career victories in 2002, and became Moravian's all-time victory leader in 2007 with his 123rd win. Dapp's .597 winning percentage ranks among the top 50 active NCAA Division III coaches.

Before coming to Moravian in 1987, Dapp served as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Division I-AA Delaware State College. He spent seven years at Susquehanna, where he coached defensive backs and linebackers and served as defensive coordinator. In 1983, Dapp helped the Crusaders to a ninth-place national ranking. He also was the head coach of Susquehanna's baseball team. Dapp's credentials also include two seasons as offensive backfield coach at Kutztown University.

A 1973 graduate of West Chester University (health and physical education), Dapp earned his master's degree in physical education from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He also is a National Athletic Trainers Association-certified trainer. Dapp is a professor of physical education at Moravian, and served as an assistant softball coach for 11 seasons.

In 2006, Dapp completed his term as President of the American Football Coaches Association, having been voted on the Board of Trustees in 1999. The AFCA was founded in 1922 and now has over 10,000 members. Coach Dapp was the 81st President of the Association and only the fifth Division III coach to hold that position in the 83 years of the organization.

Also in 2006, Dapp served as an assistant coach for the East squad at the annual Hula Bowl College All-Star game in Honolulu, Hawaii, and he received the John Whitehead Award at the Nike Coach of the Year Clinic for his contribution to the game of football. In 2002, Dapp was recognized by the All-American Football Foundation with the John Vaught Lifetime Achievement Award for outstanding performance in the profession, and in 2007, Dapp was honored with the Outstanding Association President Award by the All-American Football Foundation. Dapp was inducted into the Boyertown Area High School Hall of Fame in 2008.

2009 Season Preview

The Moravian College football team looks to challenge for the 2009 Centennial Conference Championship during its third season as an associate member of the league with the return of 13 starters and 55 letterwinners from last year's 8-3 team. The Greyhounds were tied for second in the Centennial Conference and hosted the 2008 ECAC Division III Southwest Bowl, falling to nationally-ranked Salisbury University, 21-17.

The Greyhounds, under the direction of head coach **Scot Dapp** in his 23rd season, will play the same two non-conference opponents this season with the season opener at Susquehanna University on September 5th and a home game versus Lebanon Valley College on September 19th. Coach Dapp became the all-time winningest head coach in Moravian history in 2007 with his 123rd career victory in Moravian's Centennial Conference opening win over McDaniel College.

Coach **Dapp** returns seven starters on the offensive side of the ball and a wealth of experience but will need to find a starting quarterback during preseason camp. Moravian's only returning quarterback is senior **Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X)**, who completed five out of nine passes for 43 yards with one touchdown and one interception against Ursinus College, and he also saw action at McDaniel College.

In the backfield, senior running back **Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS)** ran for 727 yards and seven touchdowns on 178 carries with 165 of those carries in the last four games of the 2008 season. **Rempe** had a 63-yard carry last fall against Muhlenberg College and had three straight 100-yard games. Senior running back **Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** is the only other returning running back after gaining 13 yards on four carries last season.

The Greyhounds have five players returning that caught a pass last year led by junior wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS)**, who had 17 receptions for 259 yards after missing the first five games of the year with an injury. Senior tight end **Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)** also had 17 receptions for 182 yards and two touchdowns and caught two two-point conversion passes a year ago. Junior wide receiver **Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** had 13 receptions for 182 yards and a touchdown while sophomore tight end **Mike Zononi (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS)** added one reception for two yards. **Rempe** contributed three catches for 13 yards.

On the offensive line, senior **Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS)** and junior **Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** are back with **Grando** as the only returning All-Conference player for the Greyhounds. Sophomore **Nicholas Marzuoli (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** and junior **Matthew Washer (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS)** saw plenty of playing time last season while senior **Kyle Passarelli (Princeton, NJ/Montgomery HS)** gives Moravian five experienced players on the line that will average 6-3, 275.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Greyhounds bring back six starters and are also deep with experienced players. Moravian returns four defensive linemen led by junior **Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)**, who had 37 tackles with 12 and a half for loss, five and a half sacks, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery in his first year for the Greyhounds. Junior defensive end **Michael McClarin (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** had 29 tackles, two tackles for loss, a half a sack, a pass break-up and three fumble recoveries with a return of 23 yards versus Susquehanna University. Sophomore defensive lineman **Seth Payne (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS)** had 13 tackles, two tackles for loss and two pass break-ups while junior defensive lineman **Jacob Millen (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS)** added five tackles, a forced fumble and a pass break-up.

Moravian is also deep at the linebacker spots with seven experienced players back. Junior linebacker **Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** had 60 tackles, which is tied for the most of a returning player in 2009, four tackles for loss, an interception with a 16-yard return versus Muhlenberg, a sack, a fumble recovery and two pass break-ups. Senior linebacker **Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS)** contributed 29 tackles with two sacks, two tackles for loss and two forced fumbles. Junior linebacker **Michael Crann (Columbia, NJ/North Warren HS)** had nine tackles to go with a forced fumble while senior linebacker **Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS)**, who missed six games with an injury, had four tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble. Sophomore linebacker **Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS)** had two tackles and a fumble recovery before an injury sidelined him after the season opener while senior linebacker **Michael Bishop (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** contributed eight tackles and a fumble recovery.

#Returning from 2007 squad

2009 Season Preview

Junior cornerback **Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** leads the returning defensive backs after contributing 60 tackles last year, tied for the most of a returning player this fall, with two tackles for loss, four interceptions, 13 total passes defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Senior defensive back **Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS)** had 44 tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack, two interceptions including a 33-yard return against Franklin & Marshall College and five passes defended while senior defensive back **Kyle Krupa (Ashley, PA/Hanover HS)** added 11 tackles last fall for the Greyhounds. Sophomore defensive back **David Wacker (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS)** contributed nine tackles, a fumble recovery and a blocked field goal in the first overtime at Juniata College last season while sophomore defensive back **Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS)** had eight tackles.

Special teams will be a spot that coach **Dapp** and his staff will sort out during camp with both the punter and place kicker positions up for grabs. Sophomore kicker **Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** had six kickoffs last season with an average of 57.7 yards per kick to push opponents near their own 12-yard line. **Heck** did not attempt an extra-point on field goal last fall. Junior **Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy)** has been the back-up punter for two seasons but has yet to punt in a game.

Hersch had returned nine kickoffs for 144 yards, 16 yards per return, and 18 punts for 113 yards, an average of 6.3 yards a return last season. **Rempe** had six kickoff returns for 208 yards including an 82-yard return for a touchdown at Gettysburg College and four tackles on special teams while sophomore running back **Philip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS)** returned one kickoff for six yards. **Falco** had eight tackles on special teams and a kickoff return for nine yards while **Zanoni** had two tackles on special team. Sophomore linebacker **Douglas DiMattia (Cedar Grove, NJ/Cedar Grove HS)** had three tackles on special teams and is serving as the team's long snapper on punts.

Coach **Dapp** will have a speed option for kickoff returns this fall as junior defensive **Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS)** returns to the squad. **Woodruff** didn't play football last season but had eight kickoff returns for 165 yards to go with eight tackles and five passes defended as a freshman in 2007. **Woodruff** won the 2009 NCAA Division III Outdoor National Championship in the 200-meter dash, and he was fifth in the nation in the 100-meter dash to earn All-American honors.

During camp, coach **Dapp** will work in 43 new faces with the 55 returning players as the Greyhounds prepare for their third season of competition in the Centennial Conference.

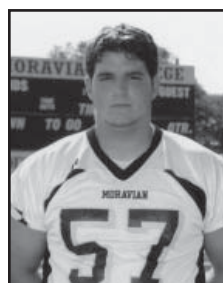

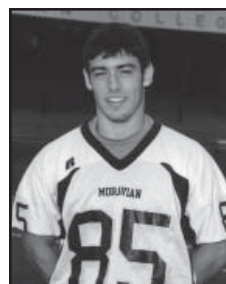

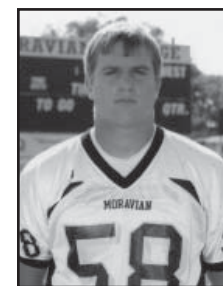
