Moravian College is a private, selective liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley, in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian College believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 20 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2007-08 school year, Moravian teams won six Landmark Conference championships, with 11 teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the women's soccer and men's basketball teams and ECAC Championships for the women's indoor and outdoor track & field squads and the men's outdoor track & field team. In addition, nine student-athletes earned All-America status including one *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-American and two national champions in track & field.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Steel Field athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

Head Coach John Makuvek

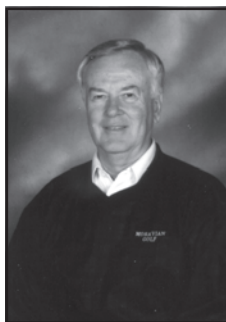
John Makuvek, who retired in 1996 after four years as athletics director, continues to direct the Greyhound golf team.

As golf coach for 41 years, **Makuvek** has compiled a 312-193 record. He is Moravian's all-time winningest golf coach, winning the 2006 Commonwealth Conference Championship. His linksters also won the 1997 and 1994 Middle Atlantic Conference titles, following in the footsteps of the 1974 MAC champion team.

The 1993 squad, with a 16-0 dual match record, was the first-ever undefeated Moravian golf team; 1994's 15-0 squad was the second, and the program enjoyed a winning streak of 41 matches in a row. **Makuvek's** 1999 team posted the squad's third undefeated season in the 1990's with an 8-0 record.

Previously, **Makuvek** held the top spot in the Moravian varsity soccer program for 24 years. During that time, his soccer teams compiled a 219-133-29 overall record and competed in nine ECAC post-season tournaments and one NCAA tournament. **Makuvek**-coached teams also won one MAC championship and four MAC Southern Division titles.

Makuvek earned a B.S. and M.Ed. from East Stroudsburg University where he played soccer, basketball, and golf.

2008-09 Season Preview

The 2008-09 Moravian College Golf team, under the direction of head coach **John Makuvek**, looks for the program to continue competing with the top team in the region and battle against fellow Landmark Conference schools.

The Greyhounds placed third out of four teams competing in the Landmark Conference Invitational played at Saucon Valley Country Club's Weyhill Course. Moravian also won one tournament on the season and placed in the top five in seven of 17 tournaments.

Sophomore **Seth Hartman (Boyertown, PA/Boyertown HS)** ended last season with an 80.2 average to go along with a best round score of 76 at the Ursinus Quad Match, which was good enough for first place on the day.

Junior **Nicholas Repko-Moschini (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** shot his best score of 75 at the Moravian College Fall Invitational. **Repko-Moschini** also had an 80.0 average on the year. Junior **Steve Labiak (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** recorded his best score of the year at the Centenary Cyclone Invitational in which he put up a score of 76 to get first place for the tournament. **Labiak** ended the 2007-08 season with an 81.3 average.

Junior **Alan Kliewer (Ephrata, PA/Ephrata HS)** completed last year with an 81.6 average to go along with a best round score of 78 at the Centenary Cyclone Invitational, which earned him a third place finish while sophomore **Lucas Smith (Wyomissing, PA/Wyomissing HS)** put up an average of 83.3 on the year which included score of 76 for a second place finish at the Centenary Cyclone Invitational. Sophomore **Robert McKay (Bethlehem, PA/Northampton HS)** composed an 83.5 average in his collegiate debut season including a best round score of 79 at the Albright College Quad Match.

Also competing for the Greyhounds last season were junior **Doug Miller (Leesport, PA/Schuylkill Valley HS)** and sophomore **Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy)**.

Going into his 42nd season, coach **Makuvek** is looking to be a top competitor in the region this year with more than half of his team returning from last year. Coach **Makuvek** also has strong recruits to gain from the large incoming freshmen class.

Moravian has seven tournaments and a tri-match scheduled in the fall portion of its schedule including the annual Moravian College Fall Invitational at Southmoore Golf Course in Bath, Pennsylvania on Friday, September 19th. The Greyhounds will have a spring schedule as well that will include another home tournament at Southmoore Golf Course in early April.

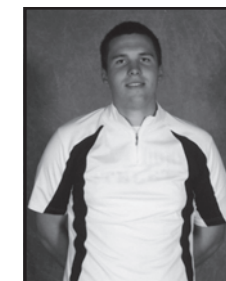

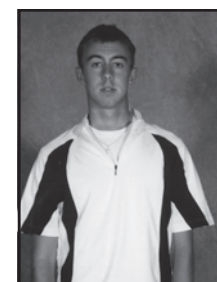

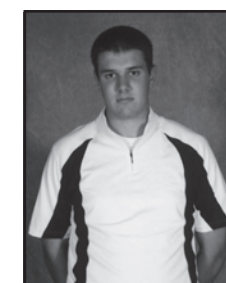
