About Moravian College

Moravian College is a private, selective, liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 18 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2009-10 school year, Moravian teams won seven Landmark Conference championships with ten teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the baseball, women's basketball and softball teams. In addition, 13 student-athletes earned All-America status with three national champions in track & field.

Approximately one-quarter of Moravian's student body participates in intercollegiate athletics every year, and many more compete in club sports and intramurals. Moravian's student-athletes excel academically. The College has had 33 Academic All-Americans, while more than 70 student-athletes earn spots on the conference All-Academic Honor Rolls yearly.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Moravian College Steel Athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

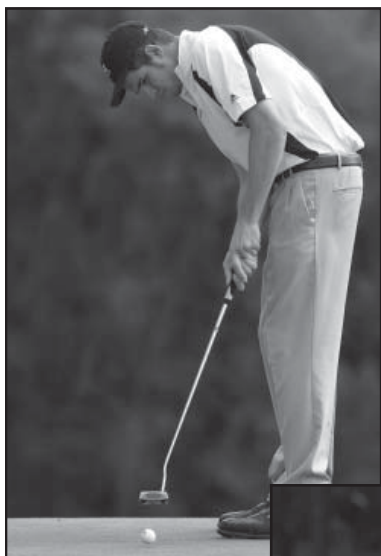

Head Coach Kevin Edwards

Kevin Edwards is beginning his first year as the head coach of the Moravian golf team after serving as co-head coach last season in the final year of former coach John Makuvek's 43 seasons as the Greyhounds head coach.

Edwards is a 1996 graduate of Moravian College and is currently the PGA Director of Golf at Woodstone Country Club in Danielsville, PA located approximately 20 minutes north of Moravian were the team host both a fall and spring invitational. He was a member of the 1994 undefeated MAC Championship Team and earned All-MAC honors in 1994 and 1996.

Edwards has been a PGA Member for 10 years and currently serves on several Philadelphia Section PGA committees including the education and membership committees. He previously served as the men's golf coach at Muhlenberg College for two seasons while an Assistant PGA Professional at Lehigh Country Club and led the 2004 team to a Centennial Conference title.

Empire 8 Conference



Moravian is began an associate membership in the Empire 8 Conference in 2009-10.

The members of the Empire 8 are committed first and foremost to the pursuit of academic excellence and aspire to be regarded as an outstanding NCAA Division III conference. The membership seeks to distinguish itself among its peer group for its quality institutions, spirited and sportsmanlike competition, outstanding services and highly ethical policies and practices. Its commitment to serve the educational needs of its student-athletes is the hallmark of the Empire 8.

The Empire 8 golf tournament consists of two rounds played in the fall and an additional two rounds in the spring.

2010-11 Season Preview

The 2010-11 Moravian College Golf team, under the direction of first-year head coach **Kevin Edwards**, looks for the program to continue competing with the top teams in the region in its second season as an associate member of the Empire 8 Conference.

The Greyhounds were third in their inaugural Empire 8 Conference Tournament, spread out over four days, two in the fall and two during the spring. Coach **Edwards** takes over as sole head coach this season after serving as co-head coach with **John Makuvek**, who has retired after 43 seasons but will still assist the team in 2010-11.

Leading the Greyhounds will be senior **Seth Hartman (Boyertown, PA/Boyertown HS)**, who tied for seventh at the 2009-10 Empire 8 Conference Tournament with a four-round score of 319 to earn All-Empire 8 Conference Second Team honors. **Hartman** led Moravian a year ago with an average of 80.8 over 11 rounds and a season low of 75 in the second round of the Empire 8 Tournament.

Senior **Lucas Smith (Wyomissing, PA/Wyomissing HS)** was tied for 13th at the conference championships with a score of 326, and he was named Moravian's Empire 8 Sportsman of the Year. **Smith** led the Greyhounds, playing in all 14 rounds last season with an average of 81.0, and firing a season low 75 at the Moravian Fall Invitational. Junior **John Dimler (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS)** also shot 81.0 per round in 2009-10 over 13 rounds with a low score of 75 at the Bent Creek Fall Invitational. **Dimler** was 23rd in the Empire 8 with a 336.

Junior **Sam Stires (Bedminster, NJ/Bernards HS)** placed 24th in the Empire 8 Tournament with a four-round score of 337, and he averaged 83.6 over eight rounds while junior **Scott Stires (Bedminster, NJ/Bernards HS)** had an average of 83.5 in eight rounds.

Sophomore **Aaron Thieme (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** played in six rounds in his debut season with an average of 87.5. Junior **Thomas Fenyak (Centreville, VA/Westfield HS)** missed the entire campaign in 2009-10 with an injury but is expted to return to the line-up in 2010-11.

Coach **Edwards** is looking to be a top competitor in the region this year with eight letterwinners returning from last year. Coach **Edwards** also has a pair of newcomers to add to the squad.

Moravian has eight tournaments scheduled in the fall portion of its schedule including the annual Moravian College Fall Invitational at Woodstone Country Club in Danielsville, Pennsylvania on Thursday, September 16th. The Greyhounds will also compete in the first two rounds of the Empire 8 Conference Championships on September 18th and 19th.

The Greyhounds will play spring schedule as well that will include another home tournament in early April and the final two rounds of the Empire 8 Conference Championships.
