Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

In addition, ten student-athletes earned All-America status, including one *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-American and one national champion in track & field.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Steel Field athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

## Head Coach Todd Ervin

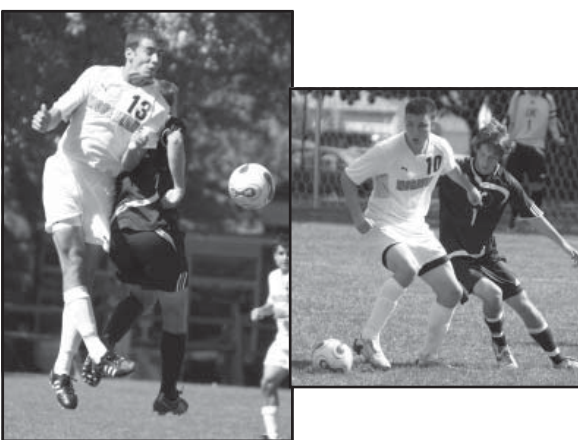
**Todd Ervin** is beginning his first season as the head coach of the Moravian College men's soccer team, becoming the seventh head coach in the 46-year history of the program.

**Ervin** has most recently served as the head coach of the Pennsylvania Stoners of the National Premier Soccer League for the last two years. His 2008 Stoners team was the National Premier Soccer League National Champions with players from local Division I, II and III colleges as well as former professional players. Ervin has resigned his position with the Stoners since the NCAA does not permit coaches to coach their players in the off season, and Moravian usually has at least one player on the Stoners roster.

**Ervin** was an assistant with the Moravian men's program for three seasons, from 2004 to 2006, and he was also the head coach for the Cedar Crest College women's soccer team for the last two seasons.

**Ervin** has his National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Advanced National Diploma having graduated with distinction. After graduating from Muhlenberg College in 1998, **Ervin** went on to play three seasons with the New Jersey Barons Professional Soccer team in the USL, and since 2001, has played in the Lehigh Valley Soccer League.

While a student-athlete at Muhlenberg, **Ervin** helped the Mules to the NCAA Division III National Tournament each of his four seasons with a trip to the Final Four in 1995. The squad also won three Centennial Conference Championships, and **Ervin** was a three-time First Team All-Centennial Conference honoree as well as a three-time NSCAA Regional All-American.

## 2009 Season Preview

The Moravian College men's soccer team has high expectations going into the 2009 season with the return of 20 letterwinners and eight starters. First-year head coach **Todd Ervin** takes over a team coming off of a 6-9-2 season and looks to challenge for a Landmark Conference playoff berth.

The Greyhounds leading returning scorer is sophomore forward **Taylor Molinaro (Scotch Plains, NJ/Scotch Plains-Fanwood HS)**, who contributed six goals and one assist for 13 points in his debut season. Senior defender **Gary Grimes (Howell, NJ/Christian Brothers Academy)** netted four goals and three assists for a total of 11 points and was named to the Landmark All-Conference Second Team.

Sophomore defender **Mike Dobbins (Randolph, NJ/Randolph HS)** had two goals and one assist in his season debut, while sophomore midfielder **Mark Casagrande (Spring Lake Heights, NJ/Saint Rose HS)** netted one goal and had three assists for a total of five points a year ago. Senior midfielder **Evan Outlaw (Zion Grove, PA/Pleasant Valley HS)** scored two goals for a total of four points while senior midfielder **Blake Ritchey (Harleysville, PA/Souderton HS)** netted one goal and two assists also for four points.

Senior midfielder **Kyle Jablon (Blairstown, NJ/North Warren HS)** and junior forward **Chris Walsh (Dunmore, PA/Dunmore HS)** each contributed one goal last season with **Jablon** adding an assist. Also returning are senior midfielder **Michael Tarulli (Bear Creek, PA/Coughlin HS)** and junior midfielder **Matt Levine (Island Park, NY/West Hempstead HS)**, who both had two assists a year ago, while junior defender **Brian Hunscher (Ann Harbor, MI/Ann Harbor HS)** contributed one assist.

Junior goalie **Bryant White (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS)** had a 1.83 goals-against average 20 saves and a 1-0 record in 148 minutes of action while junior keeper **Tim Dollarton (Sewell, NJ/Washington Township HS)** had one save in ten minutes in goal.

Other players expecting to contribute this fall are senior midfielder **Alex Kulp (Wyncote, PA/Roman Catholic HS)**, junior defender **Tim Smetana (Harvard, MA/The Bromfield School)**, and sophomore midfielders **Kyle Sutcliffe (Moorestown, NJ/Moorestown HS)**, **Michael Adams (Belle Mead, NJ/Montgomery HS)**, **Eldar Sejdic (Bethlehem, PA/Salisbury HS)**, and **Justin Morgan (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS)** and defender **Ryan McGarry (East Stroudsburg, PA/East Stroudsburg South HS)**.

Coach **Ervin** looks to help the Greyhounds earn a berth in the Landmark Conference Tournament. He has been recruiting since being hired as coach in February.

Moravian will open its 2009 season with a non-conference home match versus Ursinus College on Tuesday, September 1st.
