**THE GAME:** Moravian looks to snap a two-game losing streak in a Centennial Conference game versus Franklin & Marshall College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Rocco Calvo Field in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Moravian will be celebrating Homecoming and its Hall of Fame Day on Saturday.

**THE COACHES:** **Scot Dapp (West Chester '73)** is in his 22nd season at Moravian, with a career record of 131-90-1 (.592), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004 & 2005, winning the title in 2005.

Franklin & Marshall coach **John Troxell (Lafayette '94)** has a record of 10-15 (.400) in his third year at the school.

**THE SERIES:** Saturday's meeting will be the 21<sup>st</sup> in the series with Franklin & Marshall owning a 16-4 advantage. Moravian won last season's game the Greyhounds won the last time the two schools met in the regular season with a 14-7 win in Bethlehem.

**CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE HONORS:** Seniors running back **Tyler McCambridge (Northampton, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)**, linebacker **Kevin McGorry (Whitehall, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** and kicker **Brian Reckenbeil (Branchburg, NJ/Somerville HS)** of Moravian have been named to the Centennial Conference Weekly Honor Roll. **McCambridge** had his third 100-yard rushing game of the season and moved into ninth in school history with 152 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries in Moravian's 48-41 loss at Gettysburg College. **McCambridge** scored on a 79-yard touchdown in his second carry of the game. It was the longest run of his career and the fifth longest run in school history. **McCambridge**, who had a 60-yard touchdown run called back on his third touch of the game due to a holding penalty, added two catches for 28 yards and three kickoff returns for 34 yards for 214 all-purpose yards in the game. **McGorry** led the Moravian defense with 11 tackles including seven solo stops at Gettysburg. His coverage downfield on a wide receiver in the third quarter allowed a teammate to intercept a pass. **Reckenbeil** posted his second double-digit point total of the season and broke the Centennial Conference record for consecutive extra-points made. **Reckenbeil** was five-for-five on extra-points and two-for-two on field goals for a total of 11 points in the game, the fifth time in his career Reckenbeil has scored 11 points and the sixth time he's been in double digits. **Reckenbeil's** five extra-points extended his streak to 57 straight makes. He has made 48 straight point-after attempts as a member of the Centennial Conference, surpassing Franklin & Marshall College kicker Mark Slevin's record of 45. **Reckenbeil** made field goals of 38 and 24 yards to improve to eight-of-ten on field goals.

**ON THE AIRWAVES:** For the 12th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAW 1470 AM The Fox for the fourth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance from **John Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 12:00 p.m. with a one-hour pregame show.

**BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS:** Of the 94 players on the Moravian roster, 29 are freshmen, 33 are sophomores and 14 are juniors. There are 18 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 59 letterwinners and 17 starters.

**MILESTONE WATCH:** The Greyhounds have four players closing in on milestones for their seasons and careers. Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** became just the third kicker in Moravian history to reach 100 career points last season and set the all-time school record for scoring by a kicker on September 29, 2007. **Reckenbeil** kicked a school record 47-yard field goal against Susquehanna University in the 2008 season opener on September 6th. **Reckenbeil** now owns or shares all but one of the Greyhound kicking records. In addition to the longest field goal in school history, **Reckenbeil** owns marks for field goals in a game, with four, which he set against Johns Hopkins University, field goals in a season with 11, field goals in a career, now 36, extra-points in a game, tied with seven, extra-points in a career, with 89 after making his five attempts at Gettysburg College last Saturday, points in a game, with 15 against Johns Hopkins, points in a season with 62 and points in a career, now with 197. He is second in school history in total points, just 20 points shy of **Chris Jacobs**' mark of 216 points, and the only school record **Reckenbeil** doesn't own is extra-points in a season. **Reckenbeil** has connected on 57 straight extra-points, having not missed since the Widener University game on September 30, 2006. Senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** is currently ninth in school history with 1,926 career rushing yards and fifth in career rushing attempts with 405. **McCambridge**, who has 17 career rushing touchdowns, needs just 115 yards to move into eighth all-time and 74 yards to reach 2,000. Senior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier (Center Valley, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** has thrown for 3,390 yards, which ranks seventh in school history, and he is the seventh quarterback to throw for over 3,000 yards. **Braxmeier** and **McCambridge** hooked up for the second longest scoring pass in school history against Johns Hopkins with an 81-yard touchdown. The school record is 83 yards. Senior punter **Michael Voskian (Brielle, NJ/**

**Manasquan HS)** set the school single game record for punting average against Johns Hopkins with an average of 42.3 yards on six punts. **Voskian** also went over 4,000 career punting yards against Dickinson College, and now has 4,154 yards on 118 punts for a career average of 35.2 yards per punt.

**GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE:** Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fifth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll while Franklin & Marshall was selected seventh.

**THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS:** The Greyhounds are fifth in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 318.3 yards per game. The squad is fifth in passing defense at 169.2 yards per game, and the defense is seventh in rushing yards allowed at 149.2. The Greyhounds are third in points allowed at 17.8 per game, and the squad is fourth the conference in points scored per game at 28.8. Offensively, Moravian is fifth in the Centennial Conference at 365.0 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked first in rushing offense at 220.5 yards per game and eighth in passing offense at 144.5 yards per game. Moravian is third in turnover margin with a +1.33 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 11 turnovers while forcing 19 turnovers this season. Moravian also leads the Centennial Conference in sacks by tied for first with 14 and tied for first in extra-point kicking at 100 percent (19-for-19). Individually, senior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** is third in the Centennial Conference in pass efficiency at 133.9, eighth in passing yards per game at 143.8 and seventh in total offense at 150.2 yards per game. Senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** is third in the Centennial Conference in rushing offense at 101.0 yards per game, 11<sup>th</sup> in total offense at 101.0 yards per game and first in all-purpose yardage at 165.5 yards per contest while senior running back **Tyler deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS)** is seventh in the conference in rushing offense per game at 74.2 yards and 15<sup>th</sup> in all-purpose yards at 74.2. **McCambridge** is also eighth in punt return average at 5.7 yards per return, ninth in kickoff returns at 18.8 yards per return and tied for second in overall scoring and touchdown scoring at 9.0 points per game. Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** is first in kick scoring at 7.2 points per game and sixth in overall scoring at 7.2 points per game, and **Reckenbeil** is tied for first in PAT percentage at 1.000 (19-of-19), first in field goals per game at 1.33 and tied for second in field goal percentage at 80.0 (eight-for-ten). Sophomore wide receiver **Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** is 13<sup>th</sup> in kickoff returns with an average of 16.6 yards per return. Senior punter **Michael Voskian** is second in punting with an average of 37.4 yards per punt. Senior defensive back **Carl Robinson (Boothwyn, PA/Garnet Valley HS)** and sophomore defensive back **Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** are tied for fifth in the Centennial Conference in interceptions with 0.50 per game. **Burley** is second in the conference in passes defended with 1.33 while **Robinson** is tied for fourth at 1.17 passes defended per game. **Burley** is also tied for 19<sup>th</sup> in tackles at 6.7 per game while **Robinson** is 29<sup>th</sup> in tackles at 6.2 per contest. Senior linebacker **Kevin McGorry (Whitehall, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** is currently tied for fourth in the Centennial Conference with 9.2 tackles per contest while senior linebacker **Andrew Morrissey (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS)** is sixth at 8.7 tackles per game. Senior defensive lineman **Douglas Bocchino (Madison, NJ/Madison HS)** is tied for 24<sup>th</sup> with 5.8 tackles per game and he is also second in the Centennial Conference in sacks with 0.92 per game, first in forced fumbles with 0.67 per contest and tied for second in tackles for loss with 1.08 per contest. Senior defensive back **Erik Brinkerhoff (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)** is tied for 30<sup>th</sup> in tackles at 6.0 per game and tied for ninth in passes defended with 0.83 per contest while junior linebacker **Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS)** is tied for fifth in forced fumbles at 0.33 per game. **Protasiewicz** is tenth sacks with 0.433 per game. Sophomore linebacker **Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** is tied for 45<sup>th</sup> in tackles with 4.7 per contest.

**SCOUTING FRANKLIN & MARSHALL COLLEGE:** The Diplomats enter the game with an overall record of 3-2 and a 2-1 slate in Centennial Conference action after defeating Ursinus College, 51-13, last weekend. Freshman quarterback **John Harrison** leads Franklin & Marshall on the field, having completed 67 of 119 passes for 752 yards with eight touchdowns and six interceptions. **Harrison's** top targets have been junior wide receiver **George Eager**, who has 23 receptions for 304 yards and three touchdowns, sophomore wide receiver **Jay Ridinger**, who has caught 11 passes for 89 yards and a touchdown, and freshman wide receiver **Jarrell Diggs**, who has ten receptions for 149 yards and a score. Senior tight end **Matt Jenschke** has added two touchdowns and 63 yards on five catches. Freshman **John Kaschak** leads the Diplomat rushing attack with 416 yards and two touchdowns on 129 carries while junior tailback **Ryan Murray** has 138 yards and a score on 37 attempts. **Kaschak** has caught seven passes for 47 yards while sophomore tight end **Michael Deutch** has seven receptions for 122 yards and a touchdown. **Diggs** has returned 11 punts for an average of 12.9 yards per return with one touchdown while **Eager** has four kickoff returns for an average of 42.0 yards and one score. **Ridinger** is averaging 24.7 yards on three kickoff returns. Sophomore punter **Jeff Hogan** has an average of 34.7 yards per punt on 31 kicks with 12 fair caught, ten inside the 20-yard line and five touchbacks. Senior kicker **Paul Sousa** is 13-for-14 on extra-points this season for the Diplomats, and he has made two-of-five field goal attempts with a long of 21 yards. Senior linebacker **Zach Romash** has a team high 36 tackles to go with four tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries and an interception while junior safety **Jeff Kellar** has 32 tackles, three tackles for loss, an interception and four passes defended. Senior linebacker **James Gregory** leads Franklin & Marshall with two interceptions, and he has one of the team's three sacks this season to go along with 31 tackles, two and a half tackle for loss, three passes defended and a fumble recovery. Junior safety **Jeffrey Loberatore** has 22 tackles, a pass break-up and a fumble recovery for the Diplomat defense.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET:** In Lancaster last fall, quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** completed 16 of 28 passes for 263 yards and two touchdowns to lead Moravian to a 38-24 Centennial Conference victory at Franklin & Marshall College. The Diplomats scored on their first drive on a 51-yard touchdown pass from **Kyle Turner** to wide receiver **George Eager** on a fourth-and-one play from the F&M 49-yard line. **Paul Sousa's** extra-point was wide right to keep the score at 6-0 with 12:12 remaining in the first quarter. Moravian started at its own three-yard line but would punt after picking up one first down. F&M would move down to the Moravian 41-yard line before turning the ball over on downs to the Greyhounds. However, Moravian would punt again. On F&M's second play, Greyhound cornerback **Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS)** intercepted a **Turner** pass to set up the Moravian offense at the Diplomat 22-yard line. Moravian would capitalize on the turnover with a one-yard touchdown by **Braxmeier** on the fifth play of the drive. **Brian Reckenbeil** added the extra-point to give the Greyhounds a 7-6 lead with 1:23 left in the first quarter. F&M would punt on the ensuing position then Moravian would punt but a bad snap would force a short punt giving Franklin & Marshall the ball at the Moravian 39-yard line. The Diplomats attempted a wide receiver pass on the first play but **Eager's** pass was intercepted by Greyhound defensive back **Carl Robinson** at the Moravian 15-yard line. However, Moravian was unable to move the ball and punted after just three plays. F&M would move the ball into the red zone at the Moravian eight-yard line. After a tackle for loss by Moravian defensive back **Erik Brinkerhoff** and an incomplete pass by **Turner**, **Sousa** connected on a 30-yard field goal to give the Diplomats the lead back at 9-7 with 8:19 remaining in the first half. Moravian retook the lead on a seven-yard touchdown run by fullback **Morgan deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS)**. The Greyhounds started the drive at their own 45-yard after a long kickoff return by wide receiver **Tyler Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)**. **Reckenbeil's** extra-point push the Moravian lead to 14-9 with 5:47 left in the second quarter. **deRouen** had a career high 103 yards on 18 carries before leaving the game in the third quarter with an injury. The Greyhounds tried a short kickoff to keep F&M from a long return and would force a punt after three plays, taking over at their own 30-yard line. Moravian would get one first down but would have punt with just under two minutes remaining until the intermission. Moravian would get the ball back with 36 seconds in the first half after forcing a Diplomat punt. **deRouen** would run for 34 yards on the first play of the drive to get the ball to midfield. **Braxmeier** would hit wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS)** with a 15-yard completion to set up a 52-yard field goal attempt by **Reckenbeil** as time expired in the first half. **Reckenbeil's** kick was wide left but seemed to have the distance. The Greyhounds received the opening kickoff of the second half but would punt after three plays. The Diplomats moved the ball on their first possession of the second half though the air. **Ryan Murray** would cap off the drive with one-yard touchdown run. **Turner** then hit tight end **Stew Ryan** with a two-point conversion pass to give Franklin & Marshall a 17-14 lead with 11:29 remaining in the third quarter. The Greyhounds responded right away on a 32-yard touchdown pass from **Braxmeier** to wide receiver **Tyler Williams (Coplay, PA/Whitehall HS)** to finish off a 65-yard drive. **Reckenbeil** made the point after to give the lead back to Moravian, 21-17 with 9:46 left in the third quarter. After the Diplomats were forced to punt without picking up a first down, the Greyhounds drove down the field on the ground and in the air with running back **Ricky Allen (Pocono Summit, PA/Pocono Mountain HS)** capping the 82-yard drive with a four yard touchdown run for his first collegiate touchdown. **Reckenbeil** made the extra-point to extend Moravian's lead to 28-17 with 4:35 to play in the third quarter. F&M would move the ball to midfield on its next possession before punting the ball back to the Greyhounds. The Diplomats would eventually get the ball back when linebacker **Shane Gray** intercepted a **Braxmeier** pass at the F&M 24-yard line. F&M would drive down to the Moravian 30-yard line but turned the ball over on downs after four straight incomplete passes. The Greyhounds would drive the opposite way down the field and finished off a 70-yard drive with a 32-yard touchdown pass from **Braxmeier** to wide receiver **Sean Hill**. **Reckenbeil's** fifth extra-point of the game pushed the Moravian lead to 35-17 with 8:58 left on the clock. Franklin & Marshall needed less than two minutes to respond with a four yard touchdown pass from **Turner** to fullback **Lewie Briggs**. **Sousa** added the extra-point to cut the Moravian lead to 35-24 with 7:20 remaining. Moravian would cover an onside kick by the Diplomats, and the Greyhounds moved the ball down to the 15-yard line. **Reckenbeil** connected on a 32-yard field goal on fourth-and-four to extend Moravian's lead to 38-24 with 2:22 left in the contest. With the kick, **Reckenbeil** set the school record for points in a season with 57. F&M would turn the ball over on downs before the Greyhounds ran out the clock. **Allen** had 69 yards on 12 carries to go with his touchdown while running back **Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** added 20 yards on 11 carries for Moravian. Tight end **Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)** caught six passes for 78 yards while **Hill** had 102 yards on four receptions. **Sylvainus** caught three passes for 28 yards. **Turner** completed 27 of 52 passes for 312 yards and two touchdowns, and he led the Diplomats with 33 yards on six carries. **Eager** caught nine passes for 134 yards while wide receiver **Jay Ridinger** had six receptions for 57 yards. Linebacker **Andrew Morrissey** led the Moravian defense with seven tackles while defensive back **Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS)** and linebacker **Zach Santiago** each made six tackles. **Brinkerhoff** had four tackles for the Greyhounds. Safety **John Weber** led the F&M defense with a game high 12 tackles while linebacker **James Gregory** added 11 tackles.

**THE QUARTERBACKS:** Senior **Marc Braxmeier** completed 59 of 110 passes for 863 yards with six touchdowns and two interceptions in Moravian's first six games of the season. **Braxmeier** also has a rushing touchdown this season and has been sacked nine times for a net rushing total of 38 yards in 30 carries. Freshman quarterback **Ted Passyn (Plymouth Meeting, PA/Plymouth Whitehmarsh HS)** has completed two of four passes for four yards in limited action against McDaniel College. Freshman quarterback **Tedd Teschner (Blackwood, NJ/Highland Regional HS)** and junior quarterback **Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X HS)** also saw action at McDaniel but have not attempted a pass this season.

**IN THE BACKFIELD:** In the backfield, senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** has a team high 606 yards and eight touchdowns on 99 carries that included a career long run of 79 yards at Gettysburg College, the fifth longest run in school history, while senior running back **Tyler deRouen** has 445 yards and three touchdowns on a 94 carries but was injured at Gettysburg. The Greyhounds have run for 1,323 yards and 13 touchdowns on 295 attempts this season through six games. Senior fullback **Morgan deRouen** has 170 yards on 42 rushing attempts while junior running back **Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS)** has run for 67 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries. Junior running back **Anthony Falco** has 13 yards on four carries this season while freshman fullback **Zachary Sigley (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS)** has 12 yards on four attempts.

**THE WIDE RECEIVERS:** The Greyhounds have had 11 different players catch a pass this season led by junior tight end **Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)**, who has 14 receptions for 160 yards and two touchdowns, and he has caught two two-point conversion passes this season. Senior wide receiver **Tyler Williams** has 11 receptions for a team high 238 yards and a touchdown after a career high 129 yards receiving at Gettysburg College while senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** has ten receptions for 159 yards and a touchdown. Senior wide receiver **Tyler Hersch** has caught eight passes for 96 yards while sophomore wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has eight receptions for 131 yards. Senior fullback **Morgan deRouen** has five catches for 58 yards and a score while senior tight end **Nick Johnson (Keyport, NJ/Keyport HS)** has one catch for 14 yards. Freshman fullback **Zachary Sigley** has one reception for a three-yard touchdown. Freshman tight end **Mike Zanoni (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS)** and freshman wide receiver **Travis Gearhart (Tobyhanna, PA/Pocono Mountain West HS)** each have one reception for two yards. Senior tailback **Tyler deRouen** has caught one pass for four yards.

**OFFENSIVE LINE:** Moravian has replaced three starters on the offensive line; however, senior **Timothy McBride (Egg Harbor Township, NJ/Egg Harbor Township HS)** returns for his third season as a starter. Junior **Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS)** is the other returning starter on the offensive line while sophomore **Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** and senior **Wes Harpel (East Greenville, PA/Upper Perkiomen HS)** each have playing experience and are stepping into the starting line-up. Freshman **Nicholas Marzuoli (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** is also seeing time on the line this fall. Senior **Mike Nagle (Marlton, NJ/Bishop Eustace HS)** is making the switch from defensive line to offensive line and starts at center for the Greyhounds. Moravian's front five in 2008 averages 6-2, 275.

**DEFENSIVE FRONT:** Senior defensive end **Douglas Bocchino** leads the Greyhound defensive front with 38 tackles, five and a half sacks, six and a half tackles for loss, four forced fumbles and three pass break-ups while senior nose tackle **Don Maxwell (Berkeley Heights, NJ/Governor Livingston HS)** has 21 tackles, one and a half a tackle for loss, two pass break-ups and two fumble recoveries including an eight-yard touchdown at McDaniel College. **Maxwell** missed the game at Gettysburg College with an injury. Sophomore defensive end **Michael McClarin (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** has 12 tackles, a tackle for loss, a pass break-up and two fumble recoveries with a return of 23 yards versus Susquehanna University while freshman defensive lineman **Seth Payne (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS)** had ten tackles, two tackles for loss and a pass break-up. Sophomore defensive lineman **Jacob Millen (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS)** has added five tackles, a forced fumble and a pass break-up while sophomore defensive lineman **Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** has eight tackles with four for loss and one of Moravian's 13 sacks this season.

**THE LINEBACKER CORPS:** Senior linebacker **Kevin McGorry** leads the Moravian defense and the linebackers with 55 tackles on the season to go with four tackles for loss, half a sack, a fumble recovery, a pass break-up and a blocked field goal against Susquehanna University. Senior linebacker **Andrew Morrissey** has added 52 tackles, two tackles for loss and a forced fumble while sophomore linebacker **Anthony Carney** has 28 tackles, two tackles for loss, a sack and two pass break-ups. Junior linebacker **Derek Protasiewicz** has contributed 19 tackles with two sacks, two tackles for loss and two forced fumbles while sophomore linebacker/defensive back **Jason Lauver (Winfield, PA/Selinsgrove Area HS)** has added 20 tackles with a sack, two tackles for loss and a fumble recovery. Sophomore linebacker **Michael Crann (Columbia, NJ/North Warren HS)** has eight tackles to go with a forced fumble while junior linebacker **Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS)**, who has missed four games with an injury, has four tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble. Sophomore linebacker **Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS)** had two tackles and a fumble recovery before an injury sidelined him after the season opener while junior linebacker **Michael Bishop (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** has contributed seven tackles and a fumble recovery.

**THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD:** In the defensive backfield, sophomore cornerback **Daniel Burley** has contributed 40 tackles on the year with one and a half a tackles for loss, three interceptions and eight passes defended while senior safety **Carl Robinson** has made 37 tackles to go along with a sack, a tackle for loss, three interceptions and a total of seven passes defended. Senior safety **Erik Brinkerhoff** has 36 tackles with one and a half tackles for loss, five passes defended, a fumble recovery, an interception and a forced fumble while junior defensive back **Brad Bodine** has 16 tackles, two tackles for loss, an interception and two passes defended. Junior defensive back **Kyle Krupa (Ashley, PA/Hanover HS)** has ten tackles this fall for the Greyhounds. Freshman defensive back **David Wacker (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS)** has seven tackles and a fumble recovery while sophomore defensive back **Thomas Dailey** has six tackles.

**KICKING GAME:** Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** is 19-for-19 on extra-point attempts this season, and eight-for-ten on field goal attempts including a school record 47-yard kick on his first attempt of the season versus Susquehanna University. **Reckenbeil** is averaging 54.0 yards per kickoff as well on 29 kickoffs, making opponents receive the kickoff at their own 16-yard line. Freshman kicker **Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** has six kickoffs this season with an average of 57.7 yards per kick. Senior punter **Michael Voskian** is averaging 37.4 yards per punt on 24 attempts with a long of 52 yards versus Johns Hopkins University. **Voskian**, who set the school record for a single game with an average of 42.3 yards per punt against Johns Hopkins, has had one punt fair caught, three inside the 20-yard line and two touchbacks.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** Senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** has ten kickoff returns for 188 yards, an average of 18.8 yards per return, and seven punt returns for 40 yards, an average of 5.7 yards per return while sophomore wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has returned seven kickoffs for 116 yards. Junior running back **Ryan Rempe** has two kickoff returns for 118 yards including an 82-yard return for a touchdown at Gettysburg College and four tackles on special teams while freshman running back **Philip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS)** has returned one kickoff for six yards. Junior running back **Anthony Falco** has four tackles on special teams while freshman wide receiver **Patrick Meeres (Mount Laurel, NJ/Lenape HS)** has made three tackles. Freshman tight end **Mike Zanoni** has two tackles on special teams as does freshman running back **Zachary Sigley**. Freshman linebacker **Douglas DiMattia (Cedar Grove, NJ/Cedar Grove HS)** has three tackles on special teams and is serving as the team's long snapper on punts.

**STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME:** As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAW The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, junior running back **Ryan Rempe** was selected as the Starters Player of the Game for their performances. **Rempe** returned a kickoff 82 yards for a touchdown and he added a one-yard touchdown run in his only two touches of the game. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

**WINNING WAYS:** Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 16 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 21 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

**OVERTIME 'HOUNDS:** Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the seventh time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.
