About Moravian College

Moravian College is a private, selective, liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian College believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 20 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2008-09 school year, Moravian teams won six Landmark Conference championships with 14 teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the women's soccer, women's basketball and softball teams and ECAC Championships for the men's and women's outdoor track & field teams. In addition, ten student-athletes earned All-America status, including one *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-American and one national champion in track & field.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Steel Field athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

Coach Shelley Bauder

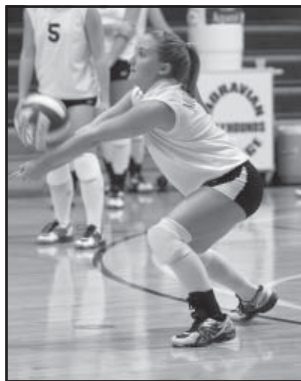
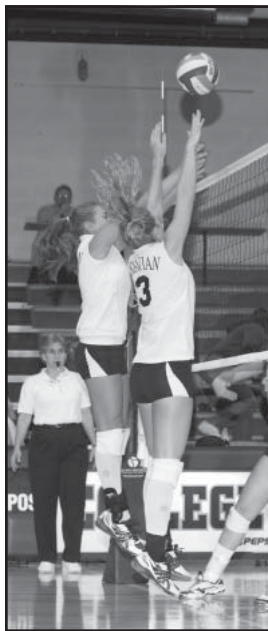
Beginning her 17th season at the head of the Moravian College volleyball program is **Shelley Bauder**. In her first 16 years at Moravian, **Bauder** has led the Greyhounds to a 329-190 record with three appearances in the NCAA Division III playoffs and fourth berths in the ECAC South Championships. Her .634 winning percentage ranks in the top 50 in the nation among active NCAA Division III coaches.



Moravian made the NCAA Division III Playoffs from 1997 to 1999 and posted eight straight 20-win seasons from 1997 through 2003 under **Bauder**. Her best record at the school was back in 1996 when the Greyhounds went 25-5. She has been the conference Coach of the Year four times in the last nine years including 2001. **Bauder** was also the American Volleyball Coaches Association Mid-Atlantic Region Coach of the Year in 1997.

Bauder received a Bachelor of Arts in physical education/education from Bethel College in St. Paul, Minnesota in 1984 and received a Master of Education with a concentration in physical education/health from East Stroudsburg University in 1993.

Bauder serves on the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Region Advisory Committee, is the volleyball sport committee chair for the Landmark Conference, is a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, and serves as a Division III top 25 national poll voter.

Adam Jolley joined the Greyhound staff in 2006 after a three-year tenure at Hilbert College in Buffalo, NY where he coached both the men and women's volleyball teams. While he was attending the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford, he coached at the high school level and played on the men's club team. Coach **Jolley** also helped establish a Junior Olympic program, the Keystone Empire Volleyball Association.



2009 Season Preview

The Moravian College women's volleyball program has its sights set on a fifth straight trip to the postseason in 2009 with the return of five starters and eight letterwinners. The Greyhounds look to challenge for a berth into the Landmark Conference Tournament.

Head coach **Shelley Bauder** looks for improvement over last year's 14-19 record that reached the semifinals of the Landmark Conference tournament in the conference's second campaign.

Sophomore middle hitter/outside hitter **Katie Moquete (Midland Park, NJ/Midland Park HS)**, who was named the Landmark Conference Rookie of the Year, leads the returning Greyhounds after 309 kills, six assists, 12 service aces, 95 digs and 32 total blocks in her debut season. Junior outside hitter/right side hitter **Molly DuVall (Sewell, NJ/Washington Township HS)** had 192 kills, 15 assists, four service aces, 220 digs and 47 total blocks a year ago while junior middle hitter **Mary King (Paramus, NJ/Paramus HS)** had 180 kills, nine assists, 32 service aces, 48 digs and 61 total blocks.

Junior middle hitter **Christine Reeser (Telford, PA/Christopher Dock HS)** contributed 149 kills, five assists, one service ace, 12 digs and 66 blocks. Sophomore setter **Kristin Hannings (Levittown, PA/Pennsbury HS)** had 32 kills, 582 assists, 41 service aces, 231 digs and 14 blocks.

Junior setter/libero **Christine Poole (Long Valley, NJ/West Morris Central HS)** contributed 364 assists, 31 kills, 95 digs, 43 service aces and 14 blocks in 2008 while junior defensive specialist **Katie Kercher (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS)** had 204 digs, 28 service aces and seven assists in her first year with the Greyhounds. Sophomore defensive specialist **Ashley Schmidt (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** added 312 digs, 24 assists and 23 digs for Moravian.

Coach **Bauder** is looking for help from a strong class of incoming freshmen and hopes to return to the postseason for a fifth straight season this year in the Landmark Conference playoffs.

Due to the distance between the schools, the entire conference schedule will be played over two weekends, one at Moravian in early October, and the other at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. in mid-October.

The Greyhounds will begin their 2009 on Tuesday, September 1st in a non-conference match at Swarthmore College. Moravian will host the 7th Annual Greyhound Premiere Tournament on September 4th and 5th with a total of nine teams competing.
