About Moravian College

Moravian College is a private, selective, liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 18 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2009-10 school year, Moravian teams won seven Landmark Conference championships with ten teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the baseball, women's basketball and softball teams. In addition, 13 student-athletes earned All-America status with three national champions in track & field.

Approximately one-quarter of Moravian's student body participates in intercollegiate athletics every year, and many more compete in club sports and intramurals. Moravian's student-athletes excel academically. The College has had 33 Academic All-Americans, while more than 70 student-athletes earn spots on the conference All-Academic Honor Rolls yearly.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Moravian College Steel Athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

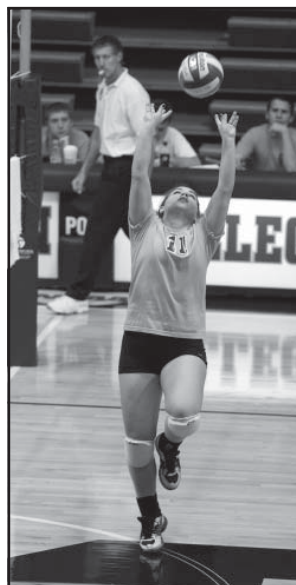
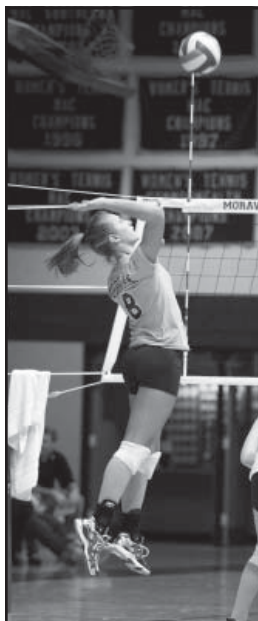
Coach Shelley Bauder

Beginning her 18th season at the head of the Moravian College volleyball program is **Shelley Bauder**. In her first 17 years at Moravian, **Bauder** has led the Greyhounds to a 344-208 record with three appearances in the NCAA Division III playoffs and fourth berths in the ECAC South Championships. Her .623 winning percentage ranks in the top 50 in the nation among active NCAA Division III coaches.

Moravian made the NCAA Division III Playoffs from 1997 to 1999 and posted eight straight 20-win seasons from 1997 through 2003 under **Bauder**. Her best record at the school was back in 1996 when the Greyhounds went 25-5. She has been the conference Coach of the Year four times in the last nine years including 2001. **Bauder** was also the American Volleyball Coaches Association Mid-Atlantic Region Coach of the Year in 1997.

Bauder received a Bachelor of Arts in physical education/education from Bethel College in St. Paul, Minnesota in 1984 and received a Master of Education with a concentration in physical education/health from East Stroudsburg University in 1993.

Bauder serves on the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Region Advisory Committee, is the volleyball sport committee chair for the Landmark Conference, is a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, and serves as a Division III top 25 national poll voter.

John Joseph Yanek is entering his first year with the Greyhound program. He is currently in his 20th year as head boys volleyball coach at Freedom High School and 8th year as the director and coach of the boys AAU volleyball club program, Velocity, based out of the Lehigh Valley. Coach **Yanek** previously served as head coach and assistant coach for the girls volleyball program at Catasauqua High School, head coach and assistant coach for the girls volleyball program at Emmaus High School and assistant coach for the girls volleyball program at Whitehall High School. He currently plays on local men's and co-ed volleyball teams in the Lehigh Valley. **Yanek** earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Special Education from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1986 and a Master's Degree in Special Education from Lehigh University in 1988.



2010 Season Preview

The Moravian College women's volleyball program has its sights set on a sixth straight trip to the postseason in 2009 with the return of all six starters and nine letterwinners. The Greyhounds look to challenge for a berth into the Landmark Conference Tournament. Head coach **Shelley Bauder** looks for improvement over last year's 15-18 record that reached the quarterfinals of the Landmark Conference tournament in the conference's third campaign.

Senior middle hitter **Mary King (Paramus, NJ/Paramus HS)** returns to lead the Greyhounds on the court after earning Landmark All-Conference First Team honors last season while posting a .253 hitting percentage, 254 kills, 109 blocks, 54 digs and 47 service aces.

Junior outside hitter **Katie Moquete (Midland Park, NJ/Midland Park HS)** had a team high 263 kills last season, and she added 133 digs, 31 blocks and 17 service aces while sophomore right side hitter **Samantha Savite (Hackettstown, NJ/West Morris Central HS)** had 224 kills, 69 blocks and 44 digs in her debut season.

Senior setter **Christine Poole (Long Valley, NJ/West Morris Central HS)** will once again control Moravian's offense on the floor after a team high 642 assists in 2009 to go with 195 digs, 38 service aces and 18 kills. Sophomore outside hitter **Jesse Krasley (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS)** led the squad a year ago with 306 digs to go with 135 kills, 24 assists, 23 blocks and 22 service aces while senior middle hitter **Christine Reeser (Telford, PA/Christopher Dock HS)** had 133 kills, 75 blocks, 29 digs and nine service aces.

Junior defensive specialist **Ashley Schmidt (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** and senior defensive specialist **Katie Kercher (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS)** will help anchor the Greyhound defense. **Schmidt** had 280 digs, 18 service aces and 17 assists last season while **Kercher** contributed 256 digs, 16 assists and eight service aces. Sophomore outside hitter **JeanAnne Carey (Levittown, PA/Pennsbury HS)** also returns after having 54 kills, 55 digs and seven service aces in limited action.

Coach **Bauder** is looking for help from a strong class of incoming freshmen and hopes to return to the postseason for a six straight season this year in the Landmark Conference playoffs.

Due to the distance between the schools, the entire conference schedule will be played over two weekends, one at Susquehanna University in Selinsgrove in early October, and the other at The United States Merchant Marine Academy in King's Point, New York, in mid-October.

The Greyhounds will begin their 2010 on Wednesday, September 1st in a non-conference match at DeSales University. Moravian will host the 8th Annual Greyhound Premiere Tournament on September 3rd and 4th with a total of nine teams competing in Timothy Breidegam Fieldhouse and Johnston Hall.
