About Moravian College

Moravian College is a private, selective, liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 18 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2009-10 school year, Moravian teams won seven Landmark Conference championships with ten teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the baseball, women's basketball and softball teams. In addition, 13 student-athletes earned All-America status with three national champions in track & field.

Approximately one-quarter of Moravian's student body participates in intercollegiate athletics every year, and many more compete in club sports and intramurals. Moravian's student-athletes excel academically. The College has had 33 Academic All-Americans, while more than 70 student-athletes earn spots on the conference All-Academic Honor Rolls yearly.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Moravian College Steel Athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

Head Coach Paul Engelhardt

Paul Engelhardt is set to begin his fifth season as just the fifth head coach of the Moravian College baseball program since the school began the sport in 1935.

Engelhardt has posted an 80-76 record in his first four seasons including the 2010 Landmark Conference Championship and the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. **Engelhardt's** 2010 squad also set a school record with 26 wins while he and his staff were named the Landmark Conference Coaching Staff of the Year.

Engelhardt came to Moravian after five years as an assistant coach at Lafayette College where he served as the Leopards third base coach, hitting instructor and defensive catchers and outfield coach.

Engelhardt was also assistant coach at Muhlenberg College for one season in 2000-01. His other local coaching experience includes a year and a half as assistant head coach of the Freemansburg Senior Legion team and five seasons as head coach of the Lower Nazareth Phillies of the Blue Mountain League (1998-2002).

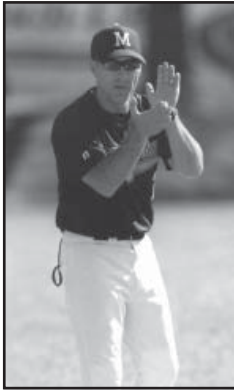
Engelhardt earned a Bachelors of Science in Psychology with minors in business, legal studies and political sciences from the University of Pittsburgh in 1996.

2011 Season Preview

The Moravian College baseball team looks to defend its Landmark Conference Championship and make a return to the NCAA Division III Regional Tournament with the return of ten starters and 19 letterwinners from last year's 26-15 squad. Fourth-year head coach **Paul Engelhardt** expects the experienced squad to go further than last season when the team set the school record for wins for a second consecutive year.

Leading the returning field players is junior first baseman/pitcher **Kevin O'Keefe (Alexandria, VA/Bishop Ireton HS)**, who was named to the 2010 Landmark All-Conference Second Team after hitting .391 with 54 hits, 28 runs, 13 doubles, a triple, five homers, 21 walks, 17 stolen bases and 41 RBIs. Also back is senior third baseman **Jon Baltz (Easton, PA/Easton HS)**, who earned a spot on the Landmark All-Conference First Team. **Baltz** was the only Greyhound to play in all 41 games last season, and he had a .319 average with 51 hits, 35 runs, nine doubles and 27 RBIs.

Junior shortstop **Dave Zubia (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** was also named to the Landmark All-Conference Second Team despite missing 14 games due to injury. He still finished the season with a .391 average, 34 hits, 21 runs, three doubles, a triple and ten RBIs. Senior outfielder **Jason Huber (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** had a .343 average. 37 hits, 35 runs, three doubles, three triples, two homers, ten stolen bases and 11 RBIs in just 30 games last season while senior designated hitter/outfielder **Jacob Millen (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS)** is back after hitting .357 last season with 30 hits, 14 runs, seven doubles, four home runs and 24 RBIs.

Also returning for the Greyhounds is senior second baseman **Jake Schweitzer (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)**, who contributed a .319 average, 43 hits, 25 runs, four doubles, a homer, 16 stolen bases and 29 RBIs last season. Senior outfielder **Mike Zubia (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** is back for a red-shirt senior season. He played in just 13 games at the end of 2010 with a .324 average, 12 hits, seven runs, two doubles, a triple and five RBIs.

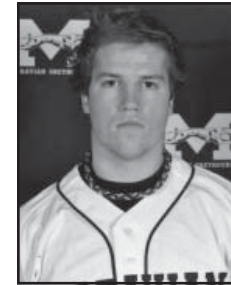
Sophomore outfielder **Rocco Del Priore (Center Valley, PA/Southern Lehigh HS)** had 25 hits, 16 runs, eight doubles, two triples, a homer and 17 RBIs while senior infielder **Matt Pezzato (Great Meadows, NJ/Hackettstown HS)** had 18 hits, 18 runs, two doubles, two triples and eight RBIs in his first year with the Greyhounds. Junior catcher **Austin Rock (Arlington, VA/Flour Bluff HS)** returns after contributing 26 hits, 11 runs, eight doubles, a homer and 22 RBIs while junior first baseman/designated hitter **Gregg Steinman (Miami, FL/Palmer Trinity School)** had 20 hits, ten runs, five doubles and ten RBIs last season. Junior catcher **Blake Shortall (Kintnersville, PA/Freedom HS)** added 11 hits, eight runs, three doubles, a homer and seven RBIs while senior outfielder **Matt Kensecki (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** had 11 hits, six runs, two doubles, two homers and nine RBIs.

On the mound, junior **Brendan Close (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS)** will lead the staff after making the Landmark All-Conference Second Team last year after a 5-1 season that included a 3.32 ERA, a shutout, ten walks and 54 strikeouts in 57 innings of action. Also back on the mound is sophomore **Kyle Longenecker (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)**, who had a 4-1 mark with four saves, a 0.40 ERA, four walks and 22 strikeouts in 22 2/3 innings.

O'Keefe had a 3-1 record on the hill a year ago with a 5.56 ERA, 14 walks and 15 strikeouts in 22 2/3 innings, and the Greyhounds will also welcome back sophomore **Thomas Fenyak (Centreville, VA/Westfield HS)**, who missed all of 2010 with an injury after being on the Landmark All-Conference Second Team in 2009.

Coach **Engelhardt** has a strong recruiting class coming to the Moravian campus and expects them to make an immediate impact in the 2011 season. The Greyhounds begin their 2011 season in the Floyd B. Wilcox Memorial Tournament at Hampden-Sydney College, Virginia and then begin the Landmark Conference season on Saturday, March 19th when they host Juniata College for a three-game series.

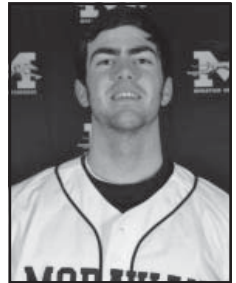
