## About Moravian College

Moravian College is a private, selective, liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian College believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 20 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2008-09 school year, Moravian teams won six Landmark Conference championships with 14 teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the women's soccer, women's basketball and softball teams and ECAC Championships for the men's and women's outdoor track & field teams. In addition, ten student-athletes earned All-America status, including one *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-American and one national champion in track & field.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Steel Field athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

## Head Coach Amy Endler

**Amy Endler** enters her seventh season as Moravian's head field hockey coach. She is just the fifth coach in Moravian College history and led the 2004 team to a 10-8 record, tying the school record for victories in a season.

**Endler**, a 1993 graduate of Moravian, played one season of field hockey for the Greyhounds during her four years in Bethlehem, which included an outstanding basketball career. **Endler** was inducted into the Moravian College Hall of Fame in 2003.

In addition to her duties as head field hockey coach, **Endler** will be an assistant coach for the women's basketball team for an eighth straight year.

Prior to returning to Moravian in 2002, **Endler** spent ten years on the high school level. She was the head basketball and field hockey coach Roselle Park (NJ) High School. **Endler** led the Roselle Park field hockey squad from 1994 until 2001, leading the 1994 team to the Mountain Valley Conference Championship, and she was the head girl's basketball coach from 1996 until 2002.

**Endler** received her Master's Degree from Montclair State University and also graduated from the NCAA Women Coaches Academy in December 2007.

## 2009 Season Preview

The 2009 Moravian College field hockey team looks to move forward with the progression the team has posted over the last few years with eight returning starters and 15 returning letterwinners back for the 2009 season under the direction of head coach **Amy Endler**. The Greyhounds are also looking forward to challenge for a Landmark Conference playoff berth.

Leading the Greyhounds will be senior forwards **Kayla Carson (Leesport, PA/Wyomissing HS)** and **Julie Bisci (Phillipsburg, NJ/Phillipsburg HS)**, who were both named to the 2008 Landmark All-Conference Field Hockey Second Team, **Carson** and **Bisci** each had five goals and four assists for a total of 14 points. Junior forward **Vita Ranella (Clarks Green, PA/Abington Heights HS)** put five goals in the back of the cage to go along with two assists for a total of 12 points while junior forward **Becky Renaldo (Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** had four goals and two assists for a total of 10 points.

Senior forward **Jillian Pagliei (Ivyland, PA/Council Rock North HS)** contributed three goals and two assists for eight points while senior forward **Damara Varney (Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** had one goal and two assists for four points last season. Junior forward **Maureen Helfers (Westbury, NY/W.T. Clarke HS)** had one goal and one assist for three points while senior midfielder **Samantha Bell (Sparta, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS)** had one assist.

**Bisci** had four defensive saves to lead the Greyhounds a year ago. Senior defender **Stephanie Dellaquilla (Woodbury, NJ/West Deptford HS)**, who was also named to the 2008 Landmark All-Conference Field Hockey Second Team, contributed two defensive saves for Moravian. Senior defender **Patty Eck (Catasauqua, PA/Catasauqua HS)** also had one defensive save on the year.

Time in goal was split between junior **Maura Acox (Old Bridge, NJ/St. John Vianney HS)** and senior **Aliina Ross (Paoli, PA/Conestoga HS)**. **Acox** played 1,229 minutes and had a 2.11 goals against average, 122 saves and two shutouts in her second season. **Ross** played 127 minutes, had a 1.10 goals against average and 12 saves.

Also expecting to contribute this season will be junior defenders **Alexandra Lopez (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS)** and **Lizzette Arias (Arlington, VA/Wakefield HS)**, and sophomore forward **Sarah Keenhold (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS)**.

Coach **Endler** has a talented recruiting class coming into the 2009 season and looks for them to contribute for the Greyhounds immediately.

Moravian makes its first overseas trip in August to Bermuda for preseason training and international competition. The squad begins its 2009 season on Tuesday, September 1st with a non-conference home match versus DeSales University at Betty Prince Field beginning at 4:00 p.m. The Greyhounds will open the 2009 Landmark Conference season on Saturday, September 28th at Drew University.
