Head Coach Fran Meagher

Fran Meagher is the first coach of Moravian College's men's lacrosse program, which began as a varsity sport 2004. **Meagher** has a 19-62 record in five seasons.

Meagher also serves as Moravian's intramural director, an assistant football coach, and a member of the physical education department faculty in his full-time position.

Coach **Meagher** came to Moravian with deep roots in the game of lacrosse. As a player, he played football and lacrosse for the legendary Joe Brune at Loyola Blakefield and played with many Hall of Famers during stints with two of the top post-collegiate clubs – the Mount Washington Wolfpack and the Maryland Lacrosse Club Rebels.

Coach **Meagher** began his coaching career at Johns Hopkins University in 1974 as a member of a staff headed by Bob Scott that is virtually a who's who of Hall of Fame players and coaches – that team won a national championship! The ensuing 34 years of coaching include 21 years as head coach of two of the oldest collegiate programs at Union College and Swarthmore College and two of the newest programs at DeSales University and Moravian College!

While at DeSales University, coach **Meagher** was selected to coach the Division III All-Stars in the 2001 USILA North-South game. Currently, coach **Meagher** is serving on the NCAA Division III Men's Lacrosse Championship Committee and on the ranking committee of the USILA/STX Division III Top 20 weekly coaches' poll. Coach **Meagher** continues to devote time to promote the game to younger players through an annual Holiday Clinic held at Moravian College and by teaching in some of the top summer camps, most recently at Princeton, Rutgers and Lehigh Universities.

Coach **Meagher** resides in Allentown with his wife Molly who is the head coach at home where the couple has raised 6 children.

2009 Season Preview

The Moravian College men's lacrosse team is looking to be a top competitor in the Landmark Conference this upcoming season after a 4-12 mark last year that saw the Greyhounds drop three matches by five or fewer goals. The Greyhounds, under the direction of head coach **Fran Meagher**, are going into only their sixth season as a varsity sport at Moravian.

Leading the Greyhounds will be senior attack **Jason Tosches (West Windsor, NJ/West Windsor-Plainsboro South HS)**, who netted 34 goals and seven assists for a total of 41 points last season. **Tosches** also picked up 24 ground balls as well. Sophomore midfielder **Robert Devine (Mountain Lakes, NJ/Mountain Lakes HS)** contributed 24 goals and 12 assists for 36 points to go along with a team leading 88 ground balls. **Devine**, who was named to the Landmark All-Conference Second Team a year ago, also had a 106-242 face-off record in 2008.

Sophomore attack **David Bennett (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** recorded nine goals, 15 assists and 17 ground balls while fellow sophomore attack **Christopher Mohapp (Jamison, PA/Central Bucks South HS)** had 11 goals, 12 assists and 18 ground balls before getting hurt late last season. Senior midfielder **Brian Cleaver (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS)** had 14 goals, eight assists and 44 ground balls on the year.

Senior attack **Christopher Danni (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** netted eight goals and four assists to go along with eight ground balls while sophomore midfielder **David Forte (Chester, NJ/West Morris Mendham HS)** had five goals, one assist and 26 ground balls while posting a 30-88 face-off record. Senior defender **Steven Carroll (West Caldwell, NJ/James Caldwell HS)** scored one goal and four assists to go with 74 ground balls while sophomore attack **Ian Harrold (Elverson, PA/Owen J. Roberts HS)** had one goal, one assist and three ground balls.

Junior midfielder **Kevin Smart (Drexel Hill, PA/Archbishop Carroll HS)** and sophomore midfielder **Tim Smetana (Harvard, MA/The Bromfield School HS)** each recorded one assist in the 2008 season while **Smart** picked up 34 ground balls and **Smetana** got 17 ground balls of his own. Sophomore defender **Michael Santos (Toms River, NJ/Monsignor Donovan HS)** picked up 55 ground balls in his debut season as a Greyhound.

Returning in goal for the Greyhounds will sophomore **Benjamin Leavy (Moorestown, NJ/Moorestown HS)**, who had a 13.47 goal against average and 211 saves in 940 minutes of action. Senior goalie **Benjamin Larson (Dover, DE/Dover HS)** was hurt 21 minutes into the season and was only able to record five saves last year.

Also contributing this upcoming year for the Greyhounds will be senior **Matthew Mariani (East Brunswick, NJ/East Brunswick HS)**, and sophomores **Daniel Cress (West Chester, PA/West Chester Henderson HS)**, **Daniel Heil (Fayetteville, NY/Jamesville DeWitt HS)** and **Matthew Levine (Island Park, NY/West Hempstead HS)**. Senior defender **Brian Reckenbeil (Branchburg, NJ/Somerville HS)** and junior defender **Matthew Deasy (Falmouth, MA/Falmouth Academy)** return to the squad this season as well.

Coach **Meagher** looks to return almost all of his team going into the 2009 season and is looking to make it into the Landmark Conference Tournament.
