## About Moravian College

Moravian College is a private, selective, liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 18 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2009-10 school year, Moravian teams won seven Landmark Conference championships with ten teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the baseball, women's basketball and softball teams. In addition, 13 student-athletes earned All-America status with three national champions in track & field.

Approximately one-quarter of Moravian's student body participates in intercollegiate athletics every year, and many more compete in club sports and intramurals. Moravian's student-athletes excel academically. The College has had 33 Academic All-Americans, while more than 70 student-athletes earn spots on the conference All-Academic Honor Rolls yearly.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Moravian College Steel Athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

## Head Coach Todd Ervin

**Todd Ervin** is beginning his second season as the head coach of the Moravian College men's soccer team, becoming the seventh head coach in the 47-year history of the program prior to the 2009 season.

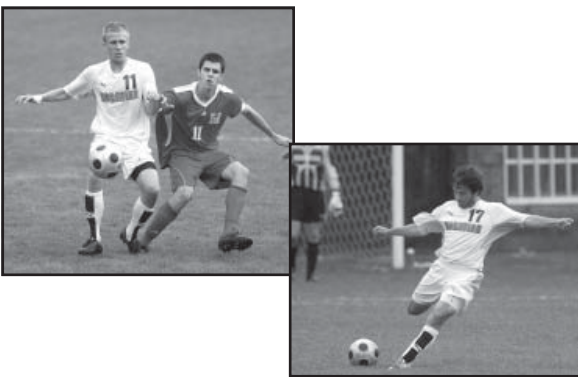


**Ervin** has most recently served as the head coach of the Pennsylvania Stoners of the National Premier Soccer League for the last two years. His 2008 Stoners team was the National Premier Soccer League National Champions with players from local Division I, II and III colleges as well as former professional players. Ervin has resigned his position with the Stoners since the NCAA does not permit coaches to coach their players in the off season, and Moravian usually has at least one player on the Stoners roster.

**Ervin** was an assistant with the Moravian men's program for three seasons, from 2004 to 2006, and he was also the head coach for the Cedar Crest College women's soccer team for the last two seasons.

**Ervin** has his National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Advanced National Diploma having graduated with distinction. After graduating from Muhlenberg College in 1998, **Ervin** went on to play three seasons with the New Jersey Barons Professional Soccer team in the USL, and since 2001, has played in the Lehigh Valley Soccer League.

While a student-athlete at Muhlenberg, **Ervin** helped the Mules to the NCAA Division III National Tournament each of his four seasons with a trip to the Final Four in 1995. The squad also won three Centennial Conference Championships, and **Ervin** was a three-time First Team All-Centennial Conference honoree as well as a three-time NSCAA Regional All-American.

## 2010 Season Preview

The Moravian College men's soccer team has high expectations going into the 2010 season with the return of 13 letterwinners and eight starters. Second-year head coach **Todd Ervin** looks to improve on a 4-11-2 debut season and looks to challenge for a Landmark Conference playoff berth.

The Greyhounds leading returning scorer is junior forward **Taylor Molinaro (Scotch Plains, NJ/Scotch Plains-Fanwood HS)**, who contributed a team high five goals for ten points last season including a pair of game-winning goals. Sophomore forward **John Pavia (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS)** had two goals in his debut season.

Sophomore forward **Nick Desiderio (Fleetwood, PA/Fleetwood HS)** had a goal in his debut season and returns up front along with senior forward **Chris Walsh (Dunmore, PA/Dunmore HS)**.

Senior midfielder **Gary Grimes (Howell, NJ/Christian Brothers Academy)** returns to the Moravian line-up this fall after missing the entire 2009 season. In 2008, **Grimes** was named to the Landmark All-Conference Second Team after contributing four goals and three assists for 11 points.

Junior midfielder **Mark Casagrande (Spring Lake Heights, NJ/Saint Rose HS)** is back in the midfield after a goal in limited action last season. He is joined by senior midfielders **Brian Hunscher (Ann Arbor, MI/Ann Arbor Pioneer HS)** and **Matthew Levine (Island Park, NY/West Hempstead HS)** and sophomore **Nick Hurff (Sewell, NJ/St. Augustine Prep HS)**.

Junior defender **Mike Dobbins (Randolph, NJ/Randolph HS)** will anchor the Greyhound defense, and he had a goal and an assist for three points last fall. Also returning on the defensive side of the field is senior **Tim Smetana (Harvard, MA/The Bromfield School)**, who started eight of the ten matches he played in last season.

Senior **Tim Dollarton (Sewell, NJ/Washington Township HS)** returns in goal for Moravian. Last year, **Dollarton** posted a 2.09 goals-against average and a .706 save percentage with 60 saves, a 4-8 record and three shutouts in 1,076 minutes of action. Sophomore goalie **Mike Brand (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS)** is also back after playing 19 minutes last season.

Coach **Ervin** has brought in six recruits as he looks to help the Greyhounds earn a berth in the Landmark Conference Tournament.

Moravian will begin its 2010 season on Wednesday, September 1st in a 7:00 p.m. non-conference match at Wesley (DE) College. The Greyhounds will play their first home match on Saturday, September 4th versus Centenary College on the HUB Quad at 4:30 p.m. Moravian's 2010 Landmark Conference season begins on Saturday, September 25th in a 3:30 p.m. match at Drew University.
