THE GAME: Moravian opens its 2008 Centennial Conference season at McDaniel College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Scott S. Blair Stadium in Westminster, Maryland.

THE COACHES: **Scot Dapp (West Chester '73)** is in his 22nd season at Moravian, with a career record of 128-88-1 (.592), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004 & 2005, winning the title in 2005.

McDaniel coach **Tim Keating (Bethany '75)** is in his 16th season at McDaniel with a 97-57-3 record (.627), and Keating is in his 21st overall season with a career coaching mark of 123-80-3 (.604).

THE SERIES: Saturday's meeting will be the 13th in the series with Moravian holding an 8-4 advantage. The Greyhounds won the initial Centennial Conference meeting last fall, 43-14 in Bethlehem. The last time the two schools met in Westminster was in 2002 for an ECAC Southeast Bowl game won by McDaniel, 21-7. Moravian won the final meeting between the schools, 14-11, in 1982 before McDaniel left the Middle Atlantic Conference for the Centennial Conference. McDaniel was formerly known as Western Maryland College but the name changed in 2002.

CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE HONORS: Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil (Branchburg, NJ/Somerville HS)** of Moravian has been named the Centennial Conference Co-Special Teams Player of the Week along with freshman punt returner **Jarrell Diggs** of Franklin & Marshall College while senior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier (Center Valley, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** and senior defensive back **Carl Robinson (Boothwyn, PA/Garnet Valley HS)** earned spots on the Honor Roll for their performances in the Greyhounds' 27-14 victory versus Susquehanna University to begin the 2008 season. **Reckenbeil** had a record-setting day as he scored nine points and kicked the longest field goal in the history of Moravian, which is beginning its 84th season, with a 47-yard field goal in his first kick of the season. **Reckenbeil's** previous long was 42 yards during the 2006 season. **Reckenbeil** also tied the career extra-points record, now with 73 after making three attempts. **Braxmeier** completed 12 of 19 passes for 135 yards and a touchdown, a nine-yard shuffle pass under pressure. **Braxmeier** was sacked twice but also ran for 22 yards on eight carries with a one-yard touchdown. **Robinson** had six tackles including three solo stops and one of Moravian's three sacks. **Robinson** also had one of the six turnovers forced by the Greyhound defense, intercepting a pass in the second half and broke up two other passes.

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fifth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll while McDaniel was selected eighth.

ON THE AIRWAVES: For the 12th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAW 1470 AM The Fox for the fourth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance from **John Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 12:00 p.m. with a one-hour pregame show.

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED ‘HOUNDS: Of the 95 players on the Moravian roster, 30 are freshmen, 33 are sophomores and 14 are juniors. There are 18 seniors on this season’s squad, and the Greyhounds return 59 letterwinners and 17 starters.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have three players closing in on milestones for their seasons and careers. Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** became just the third kicker in Moravian history to reach 100 career points last season and set the all-time school record for scoring by a kicker on September 29, 2007. **Reckenbeil** kicked a school record 47-yard field goal last Saturday against Susquehanna University. **Reckenbeil**, who played soccer in high school and did not kick a football until coming to Moravian in 2005, now owns or shares all but one of the Greyhound kicking records. In addition to the longest field goal in school history, **Reckenbeil** owns marks for field goals in a game, tied with three, field goals in a season with 11, field goals in a career, now 30, extra-points in a game, tied with seven, extra-points in a career, now tied with 73 after making three versus Susquehanna, points in a game, tied with 11, points in a season with 62 and points in a career, now with 163. He is fourth in school history in total point, and the only school record **Reckenbeil** doesn’t own is extra-points in a season. **Reckenbeil**

has connected on 41 straight extra-points, having not missed since the end of the 2006 season. Senior running back **Tyler McCambridge (Northampton, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** is currently 11th in school history with 1,375 career rushing yards and fifth in career rushing attempts with 377. McCambridge needs just 48 yards to move into tenth all-time. Senior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** has thrown for 2,662 yards, which ranks seventh in school history.

WINNING WAYS: Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 16 winning seasons in **Dapp’s** 21 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

OVERTIME ‘HOUNDS: Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the seventh time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: In Bethlehem last fall, quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** completed nine of 12 passes for 146 yards and two touchdowns and kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** tied a school record with 11 points to lead Moravian to a 43-17 victory over McDaniel College in the Greyhounds’ first-ever game as a member of the Centennial Conference. The victory also gave Moravian head coach **Scot Dapp** his 123rd career win to become the all-time leader in Moravian history. Moravian jumped out to a 13-0 halftime lead and would hold a 43-0 advantage with 12:45 remaining in the game after a 72-yard fumble return for a touchdown by defensive back **Erik Brinkerhoff (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)**. The Greyhounds started the scoring on the first drive of the game. **Reckenbeil** capped a nine-play, 50-yard drive with a 28-yard field goal, his first of the season, for a 3-0 lead with 9:58 left in the first quarter. McDaniel was forced to punt after just three plays; however, the Green Terror would get the Greyhounds to punt as well on Moravian’s next drive. The Green Terror took over at their own 30-yard line with 5:25 left in the first quarter and put together an 18-play, 60-yard drive down to the Moravian ten-yard line. The drive, which included a pair of fourth down conversions for McDaniel, ended on the 18th play with Greyhound defensive back **Ian Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** intercepting a pass by Green Terror quarterback **Brad Baer** in the end zone to finish the drive that took 11:11 off of the clock. The Greyhounds would go 60 yards in eight plays before **Reckenbeil** connected on a 37-yard field goal attempt for a 6-0 Moravian lead with 4:44 left in the half. During the drive, running back **Tyler McCambridge** became the 19th Greyhound to go over 1,000 career yards with an 18-yard run. The Green Terror mustered just three plays on the ensuing before punting the ball back to Moravian. **McCambridge** had a return of 20 yards on the punt to set the Greyhound offense up at the Moravian 49-yard line. Five plays later, **McCambridge** scored his first touchdown of the season on a seven-yard run. **Reckenbeil’s** extra-point gave Moravian a 13-0 advantage with 1:26 left before the half. **McCambridge** finished the game with 63 yards on 11 carries. McDaniel would take the ensuing kickoff and drive down to the Moravian 23-yard line with just three seconds remaining in the half to set up a 39-yard field goal attempt by wide receiver/kicker **Jay Leonard**; however, **Leonard’s** kick came up short as time expired. The Green Terror received the opening kickoff of the second half, but ran just three plays before punting for the third time in the game. **Braxmeier** helped Moravian extend its lead with his first touchdown pass of the game, a 34-yard strike to wide receiver **Sean Hill**. **Reckenbeil’s** kick with 10:37 remaining in the third quarter made the score 20-0. **Hill** caught four passes for 62 yards in the game. Again, McDaniel ran just three plays before punting. **McCambridge** had another strong return for the Greyhounds, this one of 21 yards set the Moravian offense up at the McDaniel 29-yard line. **Braxmeier** needed just two plays to get the Greyhounds back in the end zone, hitting fullback **Morgan deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS)** with a 30-yard touchdown strike. **Reckenbeil** was true on the extra-point for a 27-0 lead with 8:09 left in the third quarter. The Green Terror continued to struggle on offense, facing a fourth and 15 from their own 25-yard line. On the punt attempt, the snap went over punter/quarterback **Tom Weinrich’s** head and rolled out of the back of the end zone for a Moravian safety before the Greyhounds could control the rolling ball. The two-points gave Moravian a 29-0 lead. The Greyhounds would take over at their own 44-yard line after the ensuing free kick. Moravian marched the 56 yards in 12 plays with tailback **Tyler deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS)** capping off the drive with a four-yard scoring run with just six seconds left in the third quarter. The extra-point by **Reckenbeil** set the score at 36-0. McDaniel’s offense finally started to move the ball on the first drive of the fourth quarter with a pair of first downs. However, **Baer** was stripped of the ball by Moravian linebacker **Andrew Morrissey (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS)** on a quarterback draw on a fourth and one play. **Brinkerhoff** scooped up the ball at the Moravian 28-yard line and raced 72 yards for a touchdown. **Reckenbeil** made his final kick of the game to give the Greyhounds a 43-0 advantage with 12:45 remaining in the game. With both teams going to reserves, the Green Terror would get on the scoreboard on a two-yard touchdown run by running back **Eric Zwilsky** to cap a nine-play, 62-yard drive. Moravian ran just three plays before punting for just the second time in the game. McDaniel would then drive 71 yards in 12 plays with **Zwilsky** scoring again, this time of a five-yard run. **Leonard** made the second of his extra-points to finish the scoring with 3:30 remaining in the game. The Greyhounds would run six rushing plays to run out the clock on their first Centennial Conference victory. For the Greyhounds, **Tyler deRouen** had a game high 66 yards on 14 carries while **Morgan deRouen** added 56 yards on six carries and three receptions for 46 yards. Wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS)** added one catch for 31 yards while running back **Ricky Allen (Pocono Summit, PA/Pocono Mountain West HS)** had 19 yards on three carries in Moravian’s final drive. **Baer** completed 16 of 26 passes for 125 yards with one interception, and he had 26 carries on 12 attempts while being sacked twice. **Weinrich** was 14 of 18 for 124 yards in the fourth quarter with wide receiver **Matt Cahill** being the Green Terror’s leading receiver with eight catches for 74 yards. Wide receiver **Brian Amenta** had seven receptions for 78 yards while **Leonard** caught five passes for 34 yards. The Moravian defense, which forced a total of three fumbles and two total turnovers, was led by **Morrissey**, who had ten tackles including two for loss and two forced fumbles. Defensive back **Dominic Rafetto** had seven tackles for the Greyhounds while linebacker **Kevin McGorry (Whitehall, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)**, defensive back **Carl Robinson** and linebacker **Dan Edleman** each had five stops. **McGorry** added two tackles for loss, a forced fumble and a pass break-up. **Brinkerhoff** had one of Moravian’s two sacks to go with his fumble return for a touchdown. Senior linebacker **Derek Zabko** led the McDaniel defense with nine tackles including the team’s only sack in the game. Senior defensive lineman **Ryan Mellinger** has seven tackles with one for loss while sophomore defensive back **Ryan Blaser** and sophomore defensive back **Travis Weinrich** each added six tackles for the Green Terror.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS: The Greyhounds are fifth in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 257.0 yards per game. The squad is fourth in passing defense at 146.0 yards per game, and the defense is seventh in rushing yards allowed at 111.0. The Greyhounds are fifth in points allowed at 14.0 per game, and the squad is sixth in points scored per game at 27.0. Offensively, Moravian is third in the Centennial Conference at 370.0 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked second in rushing offense at 235.0 yards per game and sixth in passing offense at 135.0 yards per game. Moravian is tied for second in turnover margin with a +4.0 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed two turnovers while forcing six turnovers. Moravian is also tied for the lead in the Centennial Conference in point-after touchdown kicking percentage at 1.000 (three-of-three) and opponent third down conversions at .091 (one-for-11). Individually, senior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** is third in the Centennial Conference in pass efficiency at 140.2, sixth in passing yards per game at 135.0 and seventh in total offense at 157.0 yards per game. Senior running back **Tyler deRouen** is second in the conference in rushing offense per game at 131.0, fifth in all-purpose yards at 131.0 and ninth in total offense at 131.0 yards while senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** is ninth in the Centennial Conference in rushing offense at 64.0 yards per game and 12 in all-purpose yardage at 104.0 yards per contest. **McCambridge** is also tenth in kickoff returns with an average of 16.0 yards per return. Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** is fourth in kick scoring at 9.0 points per game and eighth in overall scoring at 9.0 points per game, and he is tied for first in PAT percentage at 1.000 (three-of-three), field goals per game at 2.0 and field goal percentage at 1.000 (two-for-two). Sophomore wide receiver **Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** is tied for third in receptions per game at 4.0, and he is seventh in receiving yards per game at 58.0. Senior punter **Michael Voskian (Brielle, NJ/Manasquan HS)** is eighth in punting with an average of 30.0 yards per punt. Senior defensive back **Carl Robinson** and sophomore defensive back **Ian Burley** are both tied for third in the conference with 1.0 interceptions per game while **Robinson** leads the conference with 3.0 passes defended per game. **Burley** is tied for second in passes defended with two. Senior linebacker **Andrew Morrissey** is currently tied for second in the Centennial Conference in tackles per game at 11.0 while senior linebacker **Kevin McGorry** is tied for fourth with 10.0 tackles per contest. Senior defensive back **Erik Brinkerhoff** is tied for tenth with 8.0 tackles per game while senior defensive lineman **Douglas Bocchino (Madison, NJ/Madison HS)** is tied for 17th with 7.0 tackles per game. **Bocchino** is also tied for first in the conference in forced fumbles with 2.0 per contest. **Robinson** and senior defensive lineman **Don Maxwell (Berkeley Heights, NJ/Governor Livingston HS)** are both tied for 22nd in the Centennial Conference with 6.0 tackles per game while **Burley** and sophomore defensive lineman **Michael McClarin (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** are tied for 37th at 5.0 tackles per contest.

SCOUTING McDANIEL: The Green Terror enter the game with a 1-0 record after a 38-7 win at St. Vincent College last weekend. Junior quarterback **Joe Lapkowicz** leads the McDaniel offense on the field, and he completed 12 of 13 passes for 199 yards with two touchdowns and an interception last week. **Lapkowicz** also ran for 25 yards on nine attempts. Junior **Eric Zwilsky** leads the Green Terror rushing attack with 111 yards and three touchdowns on 25 carries while junior **T.J. Develin** had 43 yards on nine carries. **Zwilsky** also caught one pass for 26 yards while sophomore running back **Raymond O'Hara** had four carries for 22 yards. Junior wide receiver **Saum Sami** had four receptions for 101 yards and a touchdown while junior **Matt Cahill** caught three passes for 65 yards and a score. **Cahill** also had one punt return for ten yards while **Develin** returned one kickoff for 25 yards and **O'Hara** had one kickoff return for 15 yards. Senior wide receiver/kicker **Jay Leonard** was five-for-five on extra-points last week and one-for-two on field goal attempts with a long of 40 yards. **Leonard's** 29-yard field goal attempt was blocked. Junior defensive back/punter **Travis Wenrich** averaged 38.6 yards on five punts with a long of 61 yards and one fair caught. **Wenrich** also had an interception to go with four tackles and two passes defended. Sophomore defensive back **Juris Eyler** also has one interception on the year. Junior defensive back **Patrick Desmond** leads the Green Terror defense with six tackles while sophomore linebacker **Paul Smith** and junior linebacker **Mike Weick** each have five stops. **Weick** has a half a sack, two tackles for loss and a forced fumble while McDaniel has five sacks this season including one and a half sacks by junior linebacker **Albert Leech**. Freshman defensive lineman **Allen Cork** has four tackles with one for loss.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Senior **Marc Braxmeier** completed 12 of 19 passes for 135 yards with a touchdown and no interceptions in Moravian's first game of the season. **Braxmeier** also has a rushing touchdown this season and has been sacked twice for a net rushing total of 22 yards in eight carries.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, senior running back **Tyler deRouen** ran for a team high 131 yards including a long of 33 yards on 24 carries while senior tailback **Tyler McCambridge** had 64 yards and a 22-yard touchdown on 19 attempts. Senior fullback **Morgan deRouen** has 27 yards on eight carries for the Greyhounds.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had five different players catch a pass this season led by sophomore wide receiver **Alex Hersch**, who has caught four passes for 58 yards. Senior wide receiver **Tyler Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** has caught two passes for 25 yards while senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** has two receptions for 24 yards. Senior fullback **Morgan deRouen** has pulled in two passes for 16 yards and a touchdown while junior tight end **Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)** has two receptions for 12 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Moravian has replaced three starters on the offensive line; however, senior **Timothy McBride (Egg Harbor Township, NJ/Egg Harbor Township HS)** returns for his third season as a starter. Junior **Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS)** is the other returning starter on the offensive line while sophomore **Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** and senior **Wes Harpel (East Greenville, PA/Upper Perkiomen HS)** each have playing experience and are stepping into the starting line-up. Senior **Mike Nagle** is making the switch from defensive line to offensive line and will start at center for the Greyhounds. Moravian's front five in 2008 will average 6-2, 275..

DEFENSIVE FRONT: Senior defensive end **Douglas Bocchino** leads the Greyhound defensive front with seven tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss and two forced fumbles while senior nose tackle **Don Maxwell** has six tackles and a pass break-up. Sophomore defensive end **Michael McClarin** has five tackles and a fumble recovery with a return of 23 yards while freshman defensive lineman **Seth Payne (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS)** had three tackles. Sophomore defensive lineman **Jacob Millen (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS)** has added a tackle, a forced fumble and a pass break-up.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Senior linebacker **Andrew Morrissey** leads the Moravian defense and the linebackers with 11 tackles on the season. Senior linebacker **Kevin McGorry** has added ten tackles, a fumble recovery and a blocked kick, a field goal against Susquehanna, while sophomore linebacker **Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** has three tackles. Sophomore linebacker **Michael Crann (Columbia, NJ/North Warren HS)** also has three tackles while junior linebacker **Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS)** had two tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss and a forced fumble before an injury knocked him out of the game against Susquehanna. Junior linebacker **Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS)** and sophomore linebacker **Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS)** each have two tackles this season with **Bortz** also having a fumble recovery.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, senior safety **Erik Brinkerhoff** has eight tackles with a half tackle for loss, and a forced fumble while senior safety **Carl Robinson** has made six tackles to go along with a sack, a tackle for loss, an interception and a total of three passes defended. Sophomore cornerback **Ian Burley** has five tackles on the year with a half a tackle for loss, an interception and two passes defended.
