Men's Basketball – 15-6 (Commonwealth Conference 8-2, MAC 10-4)

*Last Week – Defeated Muhlenberg, 65-58; Defeated *Albright, 84-74; Defeated *Messiah, 89-75. *Commonwealth Conference game*

The Greyhounds rallied from a nine-point deficit in the first half to take a 35-27 halftime lead, and Moravian came back from a five-point second half deficit to earn a 65-58 victory over rival Muhlenberg College in non-conference action. Moravian went on a 17-0 run to end the first half to take the lead but Moravian wouldn't score for the first 5:58 of the second half, allowing the Mules to make a 13-0 run and take a 40-35 lead. The Greyhounds tied the score on a technical foul free throw with 10:38 remaining in the game and then gradually pulled away throughout the remainder of the contest. Moravian shot 42.6 percent (20 of 47) from the floor but put the game away at the free throw line where the team was 16 of 20 in the second half and 22 of 29 (76 percent) for the game. The Mules shot just 31.4 percent (16 of 51) from the floor and 61.3 percent (19 of 31) at the charity stripe. Moravian did commit 25 turnovers to 11 for the Mules, but the Greyhounds had a 45-24 advantage on the boards. Sophomore forward **Brandon Zaleski (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS)** led a trio of Greyhounds in double figures with a game high 20 points. He also contributed a career high 16 rebounds in the victory. Freshman forward **Geoff Wendel (Sparta, NJ/Sparta HS)** netted a career best 14 points and he had seven rebounds while junior guard **Steve Weiler (Edgewater Park, NJ/Burlington City HS)** had 14 points and three assists. Senior guard **Willie Reynolds (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** had eight points in the game while senior forward **Ken Greb (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)** had five points, four rebounds and three assists.

Moravian won its third straight game and stayed in a tie for first place in the Commonwealth Conference with an 84-74 victory at Albright College. The game was tied at 30-30 at the intermission, but the Greyhounds put the contest away in the second half at the foul line, making 22 of 29 attempts in the final 20 minutes. Albright had a higher field goal percentage 51 percent (26 of 51) to Moravian's 41.7 percent (25 of 60) in the game, but Moravian made 28 of 37 free throw attempts to the Lions' 17 of 23 performance. The Greyhounds also committed just six turnovers in the game while Albright had 14 turnovers. Moravian used a balanced scoring attack with four starters scoring in double figures. **Weiler** scored a game high 20 points while **Zaleski** had 16 points. **Greb** had a double-double with 14 points and a game high 13 rebounds while junior guard **Lucas Malishchak (Wanamie, PA/Nanticoke HS)** tossed in ten points. **Malishchak** also led the Greyhounds with six assists and four steals. **Wendel** added eight points and five rebounds while freshman guard **Chris Betley (Lenape, NJ/Lenape HS)** contributed seven points. **Zaleski** also had five boards while **Greb** and **Reynolds** each dished out three assists.

The Greyhounds won their third consecutive game and stayed in first place in the Commonwealth Conference with an 89-75 victory over Messiah College. Moravian had a 36-32 lead at halftime before putting the game away in the second half. The Greyhounds connected on 18 of 30 field goal attempts (60 percent) and 12 of 13 from the foul line (92.3 percent) in the game's final 20 minutes. Moravian shot 55.9 percent (33 of 59) from the floor in the game, and the Greyhounds connected on 16 of 17 free throw attempts (94.1 percent). **Zaleski** led four Greyhounds in double figures with a season high 33 points. **Zaleski** made 14 of 18 field goal attempts and he was four of five at the charity stripe. **Betley** tossed in 12 points while **Reynolds** had 11 points. **Greb** had ten points and a team high six rebounds. Moravian had a 32-25 advantage on the boards. **Weiler** tossed in eight points, and he added three assists while **Malishchak** dished six assists. **Wendel** added six points and five rebounds while **Reynolds** had four boards. **Zaleski** made a team high three steals while **Betley** and junior guard **Kevin Burke (Turnersville, NJ/St. Augustine Prep HS)** both had three assists.

Women's Basketball – 15-6 (Commonwealth Conference 6-4, MAC 9-5)

Moravian jumped out to a 16-5 lead and led the final 35 minutes of the game in a 68-52 non-conference victory at rival Muhlenberg College. The Greyhounds shot 45.2 percent (14 of 31) in the first half while limiting the Mules to 25.9 percent (seven of 27). Moravian shot 40.3 percent (25 of 62) for the game while Muhlenberg connected on just 16 of 55 attempts (29.1 percent). The Greyhounds also forced the Mules into 24 turnovers, and the Hounds out-rebounded Muhlenberg, 42-37. Moravian had three players score in double figures in the game led by 19 points from junior guard **Kim Hughes (Manasquan, NJ/St. Rose HS)**. Freshman forward **Stephanie Seaman (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** tossed in a career high 14 points, and she also pulled down a career best 11 rebounds. Senior guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** added ten points and three steals. **Seaman** added three steals while junior guard **Sarah Onkotz (Catasauqua, PA/Catasauqua HS)** had six points and three rebounds. Senior forward **Kristen Sarnocinski (Harleysville, PA/Germantown Academy HS)** had seven rebounds in the game while sophomore guard **Jen Behagg (Hamburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS)** added five points and three assists. Junior forward **Tracie Shipman (Philadelphia, PA/Archbishop Ryan HS)** added four points and four boards in a starting role while freshman guard **Catherine Golden (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS)** had four points off the bench.

The Greyhounds jumped out to a 33-14 halftime lead and posted a 71-39 victory over Albright College in Commonwealth Conference action. Moravian shot 45.8 percent (27 of 59) in the game and connected at 87.5 percent (14 of 16) from the foul line. The Greyhounds forced the Lions into 30 turnovers while committing just 14 themselves. Moravian had a balanced scoring attack with just two players in double figures but nine players scoring at least four points. **Golden** led the team with a game high 14 points while **Wozniak** tossed in 12 points. **Hughes** and **Seaman** each scored eight points while **Sarnocinski**, **Shipman** and freshman forward **Heather MacDonald (Wayne, NJ/Wayne Valley HS)** each netted six points. Junior guard **Jackie Buschta (Whitehall, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** and freshman forward **Lindsay Brase (Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS)** both scored four points. The Greyhounds had a 33-32 advantage on the boards led by five rebounds by **Onkotz**, who also had a team high four assists. **Shipman** and **Brase** both added four rebounds while **Onkotz**, **Wozniak** and **Shipman** each had four steals in the victory.

Moravian suffered a 93-83 loss to Messiah College in Commonwealth Conference action. The Greyhounds trailed 36-32 at halftime and stayed close most of the second half but the Falcons shot 76 percent (19 of 25) from the floor and 14 of 16 (87.5 percent) from the foul line. Moravian actually made one more field goal than Messiah in the contest but the Falcons were 30 of 36 at the foul line while Moravian was just 18 of 20. The Greyhounds had four players score in double figures with **Shipman** leading the way with a career high 17 points. **Behagg** tossed in a career best 15 points while **Hughes** had 13 points and five assists. **Wozniak** scored 11 points while **Seaman** had nine points. **Sarnocinski** netted seven points, and she pulled down a team high eight rebounds. **Shipman** and **Behagg** each had four boards in the game while **Shipman** added four assists and **Behagg** dished out three assists. **Onkotz** and **Golden** both had four points in the contest.

Moravian had four first place finishers with sophomore **Kirsten Rotzell (Bangor, PA/Bangor HS)** winning a pair of events to lead the Greyhounds at the non-scoring Lafayette College Quad Meet. **Rotzell** captured first place in the long jump with a leap of 5.38 meters (17 feet, eight inches), and she won the triple jump with a distance of 11.41 meters (37 feet, 5 1/4 inches). **Rotzell** also placed fifth in the 60-yard dash in 7.56 seconds. Moravian's other first-place finishers were junior **Christina Scherwin (Denmark)** in the high jump at five feet, one inch (1.55 meters) and freshman **Erica Angell (Poughkeepsie, NY/Spackenkill HS)** in the mile run with a time of 5:26.08. Sophomore **Julie Anderson (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** placed third in the 20-pound weight throw with a toss of 12.22 meters (40 feet, 1 1/4 inches) while junior **Alicia Fowler (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** was fifth in the weight throw with a distance of 11.37 meters (37 feet, 3 3/4 inches). Freshman **Alexis Vergalla (Glen Gardner, NJ/Voorhees HS)** placed fourth in the two mile run with a time of 12:21.55 while freshman **Margaret Benny (Tamaqua, PA/Tamaqua HS)** placed fifth in the 220-yard dash in 29.48 seconds. Rounding out Moravian's top five finishers in the meet were junior **Nicole Sabaliauskas (Butler, NJ/Butler HS)** with a fifth place in the long jump at a distance of 4.57 meters (15 feet) and freshman **Lynsey Boggess (Washington Township, NJ/Immaculate Heart Academy HS)** placing fifth in the high jump at four feet, nine inches (1.45 meters).

Junior **Joe Moore (Andover, NJ/Newton HS)** won the long jump with a leap of 7.16 meters (23 feet, six inches) to lead the Greyhounds at the non-scoring Lafayette College Quad Meet. **Moore** also placed fifth in the 60-yard dash in 6.68 seconds. Junior **Joe Grady (Nanticoke, PA/Nanticoke HS)** finished fourth in the mile in 4:42.11, and he was also fourth in the 880-yard run with a time of 2:07.68. Senior **Matt Bowers (Annville, PA/Annville-Cleona HS)** took fourth in the 35-pound weight throw with a toss of 14.54 meters (47 feet, 8 1/2 inches) while junior **John Lesoine (East Stroudsburg, PA/East Stroudsburg HS)** was fifth in the weight throw with a distance of 14.01 meters (45 feet, 11 3/4 inches). Sophomore **Dan Corey (Fair Lawn, NJ/Glen Rock HS)** finished fifth in the high jump, clearing five feet, seven inches (1.70 meters), and he was fifth in the 60-yard high hurdles in 8.65 seconds. Rounding out the top five finishers for the Greyhounds was junior **Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/Scranton Prep HS)** with a fifth place finish in the mile run in a time of 4:45.94.
