About Moravian College

Moravian College is a private, selective, liberal arts institution located in the heart of the Lehigh Valley in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Founded in 1742, it is recognized as the sixth-oldest college in the country. Enrollment is approximately 1,500 undergraduates each year, which maintains a favorable faculty to student ratio, small class size, and emphasis on personalized teaching.

Moravian College believes its mission is to integrate a liberal arts education with preparation for life, enriching students in and out of the classroom. Moravian aims to give its students a foundation for careers or graduate/professional school, for continued lifelong learning, and for a values-oriented approach to society.

With over 50 different programs of study and more than 70 clubs and organizations, Moravian offers flexibility and diversity among all academic and extracurricular areas. The College grants the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science degrees.

On the athletic fields, Moravian's 20 men's and women's varsity teams have a winning tradition. During the 2008-09 school year, Moravian teams won six Landmark Conference championships with 14 teams reaching post-season play including NCAA Championship berths for the women's soccer, women's basketball and softball teams and ECAC Championships for the men's and women's outdoor track & field teams. In addition, ten student-athletes earned All-America status, including one *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-American and one national champion in track & field.

A Division III institution, Moravian has excellent athletics facilities, including the venerable Johnston Hall, Breidegam Fieldhouse, and the Steel Field athletics complex, including Sportex Turf on Rocco Calvo Field and an eight-lane, Olympic-quality Mondo track, both installed in 2005.

The College has a strong sense of identity and purpose firmly rooted in a long and rich tradition. Both in and out of the classroom, Moravian and its students maintain that tradition.

Head Coach Kate Miller

Kate Miller is just the second head women's lacrosse coach in school history, and she led the Greyhounds to a 24-68 record in her first six seasons.

Miller also serves as a faculty member in physical education, assistant women's soccer coach and athletics budget manager.

Miller, a 1990 graduate of Temple University with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Elementary Education/Early Childhood Education, spent the prior ten years as a faculty member at Bryn Mawr College where she served as head women's lacrosse coach for six seasons, head women's soccer coach for ten seasons and assistant athletic director and senior women's administrator for four years. **Miller** received a Masters Degree in Education from DeSales University in 2005.

Prior to her positions at Bryn Mawr, **Miller** worked in marketing and sales for Anaconda Sports for two years. While attending Temple, **Miller** was four-year letterwinner for the Owls' women's lacrosse team, earning First Team All-American honors as a senior in 1990 while leading Temple to an undefeated season and the NCAA Lacrosse Championship. **Miller** also founded the women's soccer club team at Temple, which is now an NCAA Division I program. She was also a USA Lacrosse Team member from 1990 to 1992, and **Miller** has played on several soccer club teams over the last 16 years. **Miller** served on the NCAA Soccer Rules and Regulations Committee for four years, and she also served on the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Committees for Rules and Regulations and Community Service for three years.

2010 Season Preview

The Moravian College lacrosse team looks to continue improving going into the 2010 season, and is working towards reaching the Landmark Conference Tournament. Head coach **Kate Miller** is looking to return 16 letterwinners and ten starters from last year's 6-10 team. The program marked its first winning season in 2008 during the sixth year as a varsity sport.

Leading the Greyhounds into the 2010 season is senior attack **Jillian Pagliei (Ivyland, PA/Council Rock North HS)**, who recorded 41 goals and six assists for a total of 47 points. Pagliei also scooped up 24 ground balls, 13 draw controls and four caused turnovers. Junior midfielder **Sarah Carman (Perkasie, PA/Pennridge HS)**, who was named to the Landmark All-Conference Second Team, contributed 38 goals and eight assists for a total of 46 points to go along with 37 draw controls, 21 caused turnovers, and a team leading 68 ground balls.

Senior midfielder **Paige Warbrick (Souderton, PA/Souderton Area HS)** put up 24 goals, five assists, 21 ground balls, 13 draw controls and six caused turnovers a year ago while senior midfielder **Katie Wise (Ardsley, PA/Abington HS)** added 24 goals, five assists, 58 ground balls, 35 draw controls and 17 caused turnovers.

Junior midfielder **Maureen Helfers (Westbury, NY/W.T. Clarke HS)** contributed 14 goals, four assists, 51 ground balls, 28 draw controls and 11 turnovers while sophomore attack **Allison Hess (Harleysville, PA/Souderton HS)** had five goals, seven assists, eight ground balls, and 14 draw controls.

Junior attack **Shannon Algeo (Spring-Ford, PA/Spring-Ford HS)** put up five goals, one assist and five ground balls while sophomore attack **Heather Yawger (Morristown, NJ/Academy of St. Elizabeth HS)** scored four goals and sophomore attack **Nicole Benson (Petersburg, NJ/Ocean City HS)** added two goals of her own.

Junior midfielder **Angel Genter (Cherry Hill, NJ/Cherry Hill West HS)** picked up 24 ground balls, 21 draw controls and eight caused turnovers while senior defender **Brittany Deiling (Chews Landing, NJ/Triton Regional HS)** grabbed 27 ground balls and six caused turnovers.

Junior defender **Taylor Spurduto (Morristown, NJ/Morristown-Beard HS)** snagged 13 ground balls and five caused turnovers while junior defender **Amanda Bron (Manville, NJ/Manville HS)** picked up ten ground balls and three caused turnovers. Sophomore defender **Emily Simperts (Haddonfield, NJ/Haddonfield Memorial HS)** scooped up two ground balls on the year while sophomore attack **Lauren Gober (Wescosville, PA/Emmaus HS)** recorded a ground ball and a caused turnover.

In goal for the Greyhounds will be senior **Courtney Rosenberg (Cape May, NJ/Lower Cape May Regional HS)**. **Rosenberg** had a 13.85 goals against average to go along with 191 saves, 38 ground balls, and a 6-10 record.

Coach **Miller** is looking to take the Greyhounds to their first Landmark Conference playoff berth this season with the addition of a strong recruiting class. Moravian is scheduled to travel to Florida during Spring Break and will play three matches on the trip.
