

## **FACULTY POSTING: Adjunct Faculty – Nursing Instructors**

Moravian College invites applications for adjunct instructors to supervise undergraduate baccalaureate students in their clinical experiences. The positions are in both the traditional prelicensure nursing major and in the accelerated post baccalaureate program. Positions are open supervising students in a variety of clinical settings, on weekdays.

These positions involve teaching on one or two clinical days weekly, plus possibly making patient/student assignments the day before clinical instruction. Other responsibilities include but are not necessarily limited to conducting student conference meetings, collaborating with faculty and clinical colleagues for student placements, record keeping, grading reports, and school meetings.

All positions are subject to budget availability. (Moravian College will not sponsor applicants for this position for a U.S. work visa.)

**QUALIFICATIONS**: Unencumbered licensure to practice nursing in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is a requirement. The Master's Degree in Nursing is preferred and should be in the area of nursing specialization. A Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing with progress towards completion of a Master's Degree in Nursing (must complete within five years of hire) and two years of recent full-time clinical nursing experience are required.

**TO APPLY:** Qualified candidates should send cover letter, curriculum vitae or resume, and statement of teaching philosophy to <a href="mailto:Nursing@Moravian.edu">Nursing@Moravian.edu</a>. The cover letter should describe the applicant's qualifications for the position. Include 3 professional references with contact information. Applications are currently being reviewed. The subject line should state "Adjunct – Nursing Instructors."
