## ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS AND PROGRESSION, 2018-2020

MSN Students must:

- Maintain current licensure in nursing in the State of Pennsylvania and in state(s) in which the student is participating in a clinical practicum or internship.
- Complete of all conditions listed in the letter of admission to the MSN or MSN/NP Program in Nursing.
- Complete all graduate courses, including the four general core courses, direct care courses (as required), and specialty courses for the tracks in Adult Gerontology Nurse Practitioner Programs in Acute and Primary Care, Clinical Nurse Leader, Nursing Administration, and Nursing Education.
- Maintain a cumulative Quality Point Average (QPA) of at least 3.00, and with no more than two letter grades of less than B-.
- If the course in which the student receives an F is a program requirement, the student must retake it unless it is one of the following clinical or internship courses which cannot be retaken:

NURS 710: Care of Younger Adult, Acute Care Theory and Practicum NURS 711: Care of the Older Adult, Acute Care Theory and Practicum

NURS 712: Adult-Gerontology Acute Care NP Capstone, Seminar and Internship

NURS 720: Care of Younger Adult, Primary Care Theory and Practicum NURS 721: Care of the Older Adult, Primary Care Theory and Practicum NURS 722: Adult-Gerontology Primary Care NP Capstone, Seminar and Internship NURS 732: Care of Women and Children in Primary Care<sup>2</sup> NURS 733: FNP Capstone Seminar and Internship<sup>3</sup> NURS 750/755: CNL Capstone Seminar and Internship 1 and

2 NURS 760: Nurse Administrator Capstone Seminar and Internship NURS 765: Nurse Educator Capstone Seminar and Internship

- If the course in which the student receives an F is a program elective or other non- clinical course, the student has the option of either repeating the same course or enrolling in another elective with the approval of her or his academic advisor.
- Any grade of F will be factored into a student's overall Grade Point Average (GPA), whether or not the course is repeated.
- Satisfaction of all obligations to the College including, but not limited to, payment of any outstanding charges and/or fines, and return of equipment and library books. At the time of scheduled graduation, the student must not be subject to any disciplinary charges that have resulted in, or may result in, either her or his expulsion or suspension.
