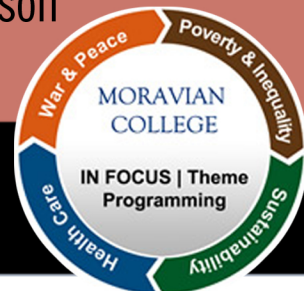
Martin Luther King, Jr. once called his friend and colleague Rev. Lawson "the leading theorist and strategist of nonviolence in the world."
