**THE GAME:** Moravian closes out the 2008 season in a Centennial Conference game versus rival Muhlenberg College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Rocco Calvo Field in Bethlehem.

**THE COACHES:** **Scot Dapp** (West Chester '73) is in his 22nd season at Moravian, with a career record of 134-90-1 (.598), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004 & 2005, winning the title in 2005.

Muhlenberg coach **Mike Donnelly** (Ithaca '75) has a record of 81-45 (.643) in his 12th year at the school.

**THE SERIES:** Saturday's meeting will be the 57th in the series with Moravian holding a 31-23-2 advantage. Muhlenberg earned a 35-7 win in Allentown last fall and a 24-10 victory in Bethlehem in 2006. Moravian captured a 24-19 win in 2005 in Allentown to snap a three-game losing streak in the series.

**GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE:** Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football beginning in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fifth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors' poll while Muhlenberg, which has already clinched the conference championship and a berth in the 2008 NCAA Division III National Championship playoffs, was selected first with 14 first-place votes.

**BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS:** Of the 94 players on the Moravian roster, 29 are freshmen, 33 are sophomores and 14 are juniors. There are 18 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 59 letterwinners and 17 starters.

**WINNING WAYS:** Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 17 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 22 years including the 2008 season. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

**40s ARE WILD:** Moravian played its first 81 years of football without a contest that saw both teams score more than 40 points. Now, the Greyhounds have done it in back to back seasons. Two weeks ago, Moravian and Gettysburg each scored over 40 points in a 48-41 win by the Bullets. Last season, the Greyhounds and Johns Hopkins University each scored over 40 points in the Greyhounds 44-41 win on September 22, 2007 it was the first time in school history for the feat.

**ON THE AIRWAVES:** For the 12th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fifth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance and color commentary from **John Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 12:00 p.m. with a one-hour pregame show.

**MILESTONE WATCH:** The Greyhounds have five players closing in on milestones for their seasons and careers. Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil (Branchburg, NJ/Somerville HS)** became just the third kicker in Moravian history to reach 100 career points, and he set the all-time school record for scoring by a kicker on September 29, 2007. **Reckenbeil** kicked a school record 47-yard field goal against Susquehanna University in the 2008 season opener on September 6th. **Reckenbeil** now owns or shares all but one of the Greyhound kicking records. In addition to the longest field goal in school history, **Reckenbeil** owns marks for field goals in a game, with four, which he set against Johns Hopkins University, field goals in a season with 13 in 2008, field goals in a career, now 41, extra-points in a game, tied with seven, extra-points in a career, with 95 after making his two attempts versus Ursinus College last Saturday, points in a game, with 15 against Johns Hopkins, points in a season with 64 in 2008 and points in a career, now with 218. He has also set the school record in total points, breaking **Chris Jacoubs'** mark of 216 points with a field goal against Ursinus, and the only school record **Reckenbeil** doesn't own is extra-points in a season. **Reckenbeil** has connected on 63 straight extra-points, having not missed since the Widener University game on September 30, 2006, and he owns the Centennial Conference record with 54 consecutive makes as a member of the conference. Senior running back **Tyler McCambridge (Northampton, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** is currently seventh in school history with 2,132 career rushing yards and fifth in career rushing attempts with 444. **McCambridge**, who has 18 career rushing touchdowns, needs just 46 yards to move into sixth all-time and 102 yards to move into fifth in school history. Senior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier (Center Valley, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** has thrown for 3,753 yards, which ranks sixth in school history, and he needs just 247 yards to become the sixth quarterback in school history to throw for 4,000 career yards. He is also sixth in completions with 263 and seventh in attempts with 500. **Braxmeier** has moved into sixth all-time in total offense with 3,757 yards and needs just 37 yards to move into fifth. **Braxmeier** and **McCambridge** hooked up for the second longest scoring pass in school history against Johns Hopkins with an 81-yard touchdown. The school record is 83 yards. Senior punter **Michael Voskian (Brielle, NJ/Manasquan HS)** set the school single game record for punting average against Johns Hopkins with an average of 42.3 yards on six punts. **Voskian** also went over 4,000 career punting yards against Dickinson College, and now has 4,759 yards on 133 punts for a career average of 35.8 yards per punt. Senior linebacker **Andrew Morrissey (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS)** has become the tenth player in school history to reach 300 career tackles, now with 309 after five tackles versus Ursinus. **Morrissey** needs two tackles to move into eighth place and 36 tackles to move up to sixth.

**MILESTONES, PART TWO:** Moravian had two players with game milestones at Juniata College last weekend. Junior running back **Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS)** tied **Chris Jacoubs'** single game record for rushing attempts with 51 carries. **Rempe**, making his first career start as a tailback, had a career high 174 yards in the game. **Rempe** started five games at quarterback as a freshman in 2006 but was converted to a tailback last season after several injuries in the Moravian backfield. Sophomore wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS)** caught a career high 11 receptions for a career best 155 yards in the contest. The 11 receptions are tied for the third most in a single game in Greyhound history while the 155 yards ranks fifth in the record book.

**THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS:** The Greyhounds are third in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 292.8 yards per game. The squad is fourth in passing defense at 169.2 yards per game, and the defense is second in rushing yards allowed at 123.6. The Greyhounds are third in points allowed at 16.8 per game, and the squad is fifth the conference in points scored per game at 26.2. Offensively, Moravian is fifth in the Centennial Conference at 347.1 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked third in rushing offense at 205.7 yards per game and eighth in passing offense at 141.4 yards per game. Moravian is first in turnover margin with a +1.22 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 18 turnovers while forcing 29 turnovers this season. Moravian is also first in the Centennial Conference in opponent penalties with an average of 70.3 yards in opponent penalties per game, opponent third down conversions at 28.3 percent (34 of 120), tied for first in sacks by at 20 for 140 yards and tied for first in extra-point kicking at 100 percent (25-for-25). Individually, senior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** is sixth in the Centennial Conference in pass efficiency at 116.5, seventh in passing yards per game at 136.2 and eighth in total offense at 138.8 yards per game. Senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** is third in the Centennial Conference in rushing offense at 101.5 yards per game, 11<sup>th</sup> in total offense at 101.5 yards per game and third in all-purpose yardage at 151.2 yards per contest while senior running back **Tyler deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS)** is sixth in the conference in rushing offense per game at 74.2 yards and 14<sup>th</sup> in total offense at 74.2. **McCambridge** is also ninth in kickoff returns at 18.8 yards per return and third in overall scoring and touchdown scoring at 7.5 points per game while junior running back **Ryan Rempe** is 14<sup>th</sup> in rushing at 40.1 yards per game.

Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** is first in kick scoring at 7.1 points per game and fourth in overall scoring at 7.1 points per game, and **Reckenbeil** is tied for first in PAT percentage at 1.000 (25-of-25), first in field goals per game at 1.44 and third in field goal percentage at 68.4 (13-for-19). Sophomore wide receiver **Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** is tied for sixth in punt returns with an average of 7.8 yards per return while senior punter **Michael Voskian** is second in punting with an average of 38.5 yards per punt. Senior defensive back **Carl Robinson (Boothwyn, PA/Garnet Valley HS)** is second in the Centennial Conference in interceptions at 0.56 per game while sophomore defensive back **Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** is tied for third in interceptions with 0.44 per game. The duo is tied for second in the conference in passes defended with 1.22 per contest, and **Robinson** is 27<sup>th</sup> in tackles per game with an average of 5.8 while **Burley** is tied for 29<sup>th</sup> in tackles at 5.6. Senior linebackers **Andrew Morrissey** and **Kevin McGorry (Whitehall, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** are tied for fifth in tackles per game at 8.4 tackles per contest. Senior defensive lineman **Douglas Bocchino (Madison, NJ/Madison HS)** is 25<sup>th</sup> with 6.0 tackles per game and he is also second in the conference in sacks with 0.89 per game, first in forced fumbles with 0.56 per contest and third in tackles for loss with 1.22 per contest. Senior defensive back **Erik Brinkerhoff (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)** is tied for 36<sup>th</sup> in tackles at 5.0 per game while sophomore linebacker **Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** is also tied for 36<sup>th</sup> in tackles with 5.0

per contest. Junior defensive back **Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS)** and **Brinkerhoff** are tied for 12<sup>th</sup> in interceptions at 0.22 per game while sophomore defensive lineman **Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** is sixth in sacks at 0.44 per game and sixth in tackles for loss with 1.06 per contest. Senior defensive lineman **Don Maxwell (Berkley Heights, NJ/Governor Livingston HS)** is third in the Centennial Conference in fumbles recovered at 0.26 per game.

**SCOUTING MUHLENBERG COLLEGE:** The Mules enter the game with an overall record of 9-0 and a Centennial Conference mark of 7-0 after a 45-8 victory over Ursinus College this past Saturday. Senior quarterback **Eric Santagato** leads Muhlenberg on the field having completed 127 of 201 passes for 1,774 yards with 18 touchdowns and just four interceptions. **Santagato's** top targets have been junior wide receiver **Phil Cresta**, who has 55 receptions for 974 yards and nine touchdowns, and senior wide receiver **Joe Caporoso**, who has caught 22 passes for 268 yards and three scores. Senior wide receiver **Edward DeRisi** has contributed 16 receptions for 205 yards and two touchdowns while senior fullback **Erik Snyder** has 15 catches for 170 yards and two scores. Senior running back **John DeLuca** leads the Mule rushing attack with 1,456 yards and 14 touchdowns on 285 carries. **Santagato** has added 264 yards and five touchdowns on 53 attempts while **Snyder** has run for 150 yards and two scores on 40 carries. Junior running back **Codie Bender** is the only other Muhlenberg runner in double digit attempts with 100 yards on 22 carries this fall. **Snyder** has added 11 kickoff returns for an average of 23.0 yards per return while senior defensive back **Brandon Doyle** has 20 punt returns for an average of 84 yards per return. Senior defensive back/punter **David Mazzola** is averaging 37.0 yards per punt on 30 kicks with a long of 64 yards while sophomore kicker **Michael Katz** has made all 42 of his extra-point attempts this season and seven-of-ten field goals with a long of 42 yards. **Doyle** and senior linebacker **Matt Rathbun** lead Muhlenberg with four interceptions in while junior defensive back **Cameron Ahouse** has three interceptions. **Rathbun** and **Ahouse** each have an interception return for a touchdown this fall. **Rathbun** leads the Muhlenberg defense with 62 tackles including 12 and a half for loss, two sacks, five passes defended and a forced fumble. Junior defensive lineman **Frank Emmett** has contributed 39 tackles with five and a half for loss, two and a half sacks, four passes defended and a fumble recovery while **Ahouse** has 36 stops and nine passes defended. Sophomore linebacker **Scott Gavin** has added 36 tackles with five and a half for loss, a sack and two passes defended for the Mules while junior defensive end **Jeremiah Lachaud** has a team high five sacks among his nine tackles this season that include six tackles for loss. **Mazzola** has added 27 tackles with one for loss, three passes defended and a fumble recovery while **Doyle** has 22 tackles and nine passes defended in seven games for Muhlenberg.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET:** Quarterback **Eric Santagato** completed 15 of 19 passes for a career high 297 yards with two touchdowns, and he added a rushing touchdown to lead Muhlenberg College to a 35-7 victory over Moravian College in Centennial Conference action at Scotty Wood Stadium. The game marked the first time in 25 years that the two rivals have competed in the same conference. **Santagato** was named Muhlenberg's Most Valuable Player of the Game for the third straight year while Moravian junior defensive back **Erik Brinkerhoff** was named the Moravian MVP. **Brinkerhoff** had 11 tackles and forced a fumble in the game. Moravian received the opening kickoff and picked up a pair of first downs before punting the ball. Punter **Michael Voskian** bounced his kick down around the ten yard line and wide receiver **Alex Hersch** kept the ball out of the end zone, pinning Muhlenberg at its own one-yard line. The Mules had just one first down before punting, but the Greyhounds were unable to pick up a first down. **Voskian's** second punt hung up long enough for Moravian wide receiver **Sean Hill** to hit Muhlenberg's **Brandon Doyle** as soon as he caught the pass, keeping the Muhlenberg offense at its own seven-yard line to start the drive. After a scoreless first quarter, the Mules would take a 7-0 lead on the first play of the second quarter to cap off the 93-yard drive. **Santagato** hit tight end **Matt Johnson** with a 19-yard scoring pass. **Jordan Grube** hit the extra-point for a 2-0 Muhlenberg lead with 14:53 remaining in the first half. Moravian would be unable to pick up a first down on its second straight drive before punting. The Mules needed just four plays to extend the lead. **Santagato** hit sophomore wide receiver **Phil Cresta** with a 59-yard pass on the first play of the drive to put the ball inside the five-yard line. Three plays later, **Santagato** scored from two

yards out on a quarterback option. **Grube's** extra-point gave the Mules a 14-0 lead with 11:08 remaining in the second quarter. The Greyhounds picked up just one first down on its next drive before punting for the fourth time in the game with **Voskian** putting the ball inside the 11-yard line for the third time of the game. Moravian's defense held Muhlenberg without a first down and forced a Mule punt. Moravian was able to pick up a pair of first downs before a pass interference penalty gave the Greyhounds the ball in the red zone. Moravian moved the ball to the one-yard line where quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** was stopped on a fourth-and-goal play, just inches shy of the goal line. The Mules were able to just get two yards on three plays and a short punt gave Moravian the ball back at the Muhlenberg 25-yard line. **Braxmeier** threw three incomplete passes all intended for wide receiver **Tyler Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** before kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** attempted a 42-yard field goal that was short with 27 seconds remaining in the first half. Muhlenberg had one last shot for points in the second quarter with **Santagato** moving the Mules to the Moravian 27-yard line where **Grube** attempted a 44-yard field goal attempt on the final play of the first half that also fell short. The Mules received the opening kickoff of the second half and appeared to be stopped without a first down, however, junior running back **Erik Snyder** took a short snap as Muhlenberg lined up to punt and ran 32-yards for the first down to the Moravian 14-yard line. Three plays later, **Santagato** hit **Cresta** with a four-yard touchdown pass. **Grube** added the extra-point for a 21-0 lead with 11:45 remaining in the third quarter. Moravian's first offensive play of the second half was a 33-yard completion from **Ryan Rempe**, who played tailback in the game, to **Tyler Hersch**; however, the Greyhounds turned the ball over on downs at the four-yard line when **Hill** was unable to grab **Braxmeier's** fourth down pass in the end zone. The Greyhounds got the ball right back when **Brinkerhoff** forced Muhlenberg wide receiver **Mickey Norton** to fumble a completed 33-yard pass on the first play of the Mules drive. Moravian defensive back **Carl Robinson** recovered the ball, giving the Greyhounds possession at the Muhlenberg 37-yard line. After a pair of long completions by **Braxmeier**, running back **Tyler McCambridge** dove in from one yard line for Moravian's first points of the game. **Reckenbeil** added the extra-point to cut the Mules lead to 21-7 with 6:58 remaining in the third quarter. **Doyle** had a 37-yard kickoff return for the Mules on the ensuing kickoff as Muhlenberg began its drive at the Moravian 43-yard line. The Mules moved the ball down into the red zone before a pair of 15-yard penalties moved Muhlenberg back near midfield forcing a punt. Moravian, which started on its own nine-yard line, would move down to the Muhlenberg 41-yard line before a penalty and sack forced the Greyhounds to punt late in the third quarter. The Mules put together an 11-play, 81 yard drive with running back **John DeLuca** finishing off the drive with a four-yard touchdown run with 11:22 remaining on the clock. **Grube's** extra-point kick pushed the Muhlenberg lead to 28-7. Moravian would pick up a first down on its next drive before **Doyle** intercepted a **Braxmeier** pass at the Muhlenberg 41-yard line. The teams would trade punts before the Mules drove down into the red zone again. **DeLuca** capped the scoring in the game with a 12-yard touchdown run off of the right side. **Grube's** fifth extra-point of the game gave Muhlenberg a 35-7 lead with 4:07 remaining in the game. Mule defensive back **San Koch** ended Moravian's final drive with an interception at the Muhlenberg 42-yard line. Muhlenberg would eventually run out the clock. **DeLuca** led the Mule rushing attack with 133 yards and two touchdowns on 28 carries including 65 yards on 11 carries and two scores in the fourth quarter. **Snyder** added 33 yards on four attempts while **Santagato** had 28 yards on 13 carries while being sacked three times by the Moravian defense. **Cresta** led the Muhlenberg receivers with five catches for 133 yards while **Johnson** also caught five passes for 83 yards. **Braxmeier** completed seven of 24 passes for 95 yards with two interceptions and he was sacked twice while gaining nine yards on seven carries. **McCambridge** led the Moravian rushing attack with 55 yards on 23 carries to go with his touchdown while **Rempe** had a yard on three carries and the one completed pass for 33 yards. Wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus** caught three passes for 59 yards while **Hill** had three receptions for 35 yards. Senior linebacker **Dustin Good** led the Muhlenberg defense with eight tackles including three for loss while senior linebacker **Tom Tarsitano** had six stops and a pass break-up. Senior defensive lineman **Chris Musselman** has five tackles with two for loss, a sack and two pass break-ups while **Doyle** added four tackles, three pass break-ups and an interception. Linebacker **Kevin McGorry** led the Greyhound defense with 12 tackles including one for loss while **Brinkerhoff** had 11 tackles and the forced

fumble. **Robinson**, linebacker **Philip Bortz** (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS), who was making his first career start for an injured junior **Andrew Morrissey** and linebacker **Zach Sanitago** each had eight tackles with **Bortz** contributing three tackles for loss and one and a half sacks and **Santiago** adding a sack.

**TURNOVERS ARE KEY:** Moravian currently leads the Centennial Conference and is ranked in the top 20 in the nation in turnover margin at +1.22 per game. In the two games the Greyhounds have lost in 2008, Moravian has had more turnovers than its opponents (3 to 1 at Dickinson College and 4 to 2 at Gettysburg College). Moravian is 1-0 when having an equal number of turnovers (4 each at Juniata College) and 6-0 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent.

**FIRST DOWNS ARE IMPORTANT TOO:** The Greyhounds have had at least 20 first downs in six of their nine games, and Moravian is a perfect 6-0 in those contests. The Greyhounds have also had more first downs than their opponents in each of those games. In Moravian's two losses, the squad had fewer first downs (17 to 13 at Dickinson College and 26 to 17 at Gettysburg College). Just once this season has Moravian won with fewer first downs (23-16 for Johns Hopkins University); however, the Greyhounds forced five turnovers in the game while not turning the ball over.

**TOTAL OFFENSE:** Moravian is 7-0 this season when running at least 61 plays in a game, and 0-2 when running 60 or fewer plays. The Greyhounds are also 7-1 when controlling the ball for more than 30 minutes in a game.

**THE QUARTERBACKS:** Senior **Marc Braxmeier** completed 91 of 176 passes for 1,226 yards with seven touchdowns and six interceptions in Moravian's first nine games of the season. **Braxmeier** also has four rushing touchdowns this season and has been sacked 14 times for a net rushing total of 23 yards in 46 carries. Junior **Patrick Weiss** (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X) completed five out of nine passes for 43 yards with one touchdown and one interception in Moravian's game against Ursinus College, and he also saw action at McDaniel College. **Weiss** has also run for 15 yards on three carries while not being sacked. Freshman quarterback **Ted Passyn** (Plymouth Meeting, PA/Plymouth Whitehall HS) has completed two of four passes for four yards in limited action against McDaniel while freshman quarterback **Tedd Teschner** (Blackwood, NJ/Highland Regional HS) also saw action at McDaniel but has not attempted a pass this season.

**IN THE BACKFIELD:** In the backfield, senior running back **Tyler McCambridge**, who missed the game at Juniata College with an injury, has a team high 812 yards and nine touchdowns on 138 carries that included a career long run of 79 yards at Gettysburg College, the fifth longest run in school history, while senior running back **Tyler deRouen** has 445 yards and three touchdowns on a 94 carries but was injured at Gettysburg and knocked out for the season. The Greyhounds have run for 1,851 yards and 18 touchdowns on 460 attempts this season through nine games. Senior fullback **Morgan deRouen** (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS), who also missed the Juniata game with an injury, has 210 yards on 56 rushing attempts while junior running back **Ryan Rempe** has run for 361 yards and a touchdown on 96 carries. Junior running back **Anthony Falco** (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has 13 yards on four carries this season while freshman fullback **Zachary Sigley** (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) has 11 yards on seven attempts.

**THE WIDE RECEIVERS:** The Greyhounds have had 13 different players catch a pass this season led by senior wide receiver **Tyler Hersch**, who has caught 18 passes for 200 yards and a touchdown. Junior tight end **Brian Dencker** (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) has 15 receptions for 166 yards and two touchdowns, and he has caught two two-point conversion passes this season, while sophomore wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus** has 15 receptions for 217 yards after missing the first five games of the year with an injury. Senior wide receiver **Tyler Williams** (Coplay, PA/Whitehall HS) has 13 receptions for a team high 268 yards and a touchdown after a career high 129 yards receiving at Gettysburg College while senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** has 13 receptions for 170 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has 11 receptions for 155 yards and a touchdown while senior fullback **Morgan deRouen** has six catches for 63 yards and a score. Senior tight end **Nick Johnson** (Keyport, NJ/Keyport HS) has one catch for 14 yards while freshman fullback **Zachary Sigley** has one reception for a three-yard touchdown. Freshman tight end **Mike**

**Zanoni** (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) and freshman wide receiver **Travis Gearhart** (Tobyhanna, PA/Pocono Mountain West HS) each have one reception for two yards. Senior tailback **Tyler deRouen** has caught one pass for four yards while junior running back **Ryan Rempe** has two catches for nine yards on the year.

**OFFENSIVE LINE:** Moravian has replaced three starters on the offensive line; however, senior **Timothy McBride** (Egg Harbor Township, NJ/Egg Harbor Township HS) returns for his third season as a starter. Junior **Andrew Grando** (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) is the other returning starter on the offensive line while sophomore **Daniel Cancelliere** (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) and senior **Wes Harpel** (East Greenville, PA/Upper Perkiomen HS) each have playing experience and are stepping into the starting line-up. Freshman **Nicholas Marzuoli** (Easton, PA/Easton HS) and sophomore **Matthew Washer** (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) are also seeing time on the line this fall. Senior **Mike Nagle** (Marlton, NJ/Bishop Eustace HS) is making the switch from defensive line to offensive line and starts at center for the Greyhounds. Moravian's front five in 2008 averages 6-2, 275.

**DEFENSIVE FRONT:** Senior defensive end **Doug Bocchino** leads the Greyhound defensive front with 54 tackles, eight sacks, 11 tackles for loss, five forced fumbles, three pass break-ups and a fumble recovery while senior nose tackle **Don Maxwell** has 32 tackles, four and a half a tackle for loss, one and a half sacks, four pass break-ups, two fumble recoveries including an eight-yard touchdown at McDaniel College and a blocked field goal in the third overtime at Juniata College. **Maxwell** missed the game at Gettysburg College with an injury. Sophomore defensive end **Michael McClarin** (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has 19 tackles, a tackle for loss, a pass break-up and two fumble recoveries with a return of 23 yards versus Susquehanna University while sophomore defensive lineman **Allen Petros** has 19 tackles with eight and a half for loss and three and a half sacks. Freshman defensive lineman **Seth Payne** (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) had 13 tackles, two tackles for loss and two pass break-ups while sophomore defensive lineman **Jacob Millen** (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) has added five tackles, a forced fumble and a pass break-up.

**THE LINEBACKER CORPS:** Senior linebacker **Andrew Morrissey** leads the Moravian defense and the linebackers with 76 tackles, four and a half tackles for loss, a pass break-up and two forced fumbles while senior linebacker **Kevin McGorry** has also added 76 tackles on the season to go with four and a half tackles for loss, one sack, two fumble recoveries, a pass break-up and a blocked field goal against Susquehanna University. Sophomore linebacker **Anthony Carney** has 45 tackles, three and a half tackles for loss, a sack and two pass break-ups. Junior linebacker **Derek Protasiewicz** (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) has contributed 24 tackles with two sacks, two tackles for loss and two forced fumbles while sophomore linebacker/defensive back **Jason Lauver** (Winfield, PA/Selinsgrove Area HS) has added 24 tackles with a sack, two tackles for loss and a fumble recovery. Sophomore linebacker **Michael Crann** (Columbia, NJ/North Warren HS) has nine tackles to go with a forced fumble while junior linebacker **Jayson Williams** (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS), who has missed six games with an injury, has four tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble. Sophomore linebacker **Philip Bortz** had two tackles and a fumble recovery before an injury sidelined him after the season opener while junior linebacker **Michael Bishop** (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has contributed seven tackles and a fumble recovery.

**THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD:** In the defensive backfield, senior safety **Carl Robinson** has made 52 tackles to go along with a sack, two tackles for loss, five interceptions, a total of 11 passes defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery while sophomore cornerback **Daniel Burley** has contributed 50 tackles on the year with two tackles for loss, four interceptions and 11 passes defended. Senior safety **Erik Brinkerhoff** has 45 tackles with one and a half tackles for loss, seven passes defended, a fumble recovery, two interceptions and two forced fumbles while junior defensive back **Brad Bodine** has 30 tackles, two tackles for loss, two interceptions including a 33-yard return against Franklin & Marshall College and five passes defended. Junior defensive back **Kyle Krupa** (Ashley, PA/Hanover HS) has 11 tackles this fall for the Greyhounds. Freshman defensive back **David Wacker** (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) has nine

tackles, a fumble recovery and a blocked field goal in the first overtime at Juniata College while sophomore defensive back **Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS)** has seven tackles.

**KICKING GAME:** Senior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** is 25-for-25 on extra-point attempts this season, and 13-for-19 on field goal attempts including a school record 47-yard kick on his first attempt of the season versus Susquehanna University. **Reckenbeil** is averaging 54.4 yards per kickoff as well on 38 kickoffs, making opponents receive the kickoff at their own 16-yard line. Freshman kicker **Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** has six kickoffs this season with an average of 57.7 yards per kick to push opponents near their own 12-yard line to receive the ball. Senior punter **Michael Voskian** is averaging 38.5 yards per punt on 39 attempts with a career long of 56 yards versus Ursinus College. **Voskian**, who set the school record for a single game with an average of 38.5 yards per punt against Johns Hopkins University, has had four punts fair caught, six inside the 20-yard line and four touchbacks.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** Senior running back **Tyler McCambridge** has ten kickoff returns for 188 yards, an average of 18.8 yards per return, and seven punt returns for 40 yards, an average of 5.7 yards per return while sophomore wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has returned seven kickoffs for 116 yards, 16.6 yards per return, and 13 punts for 101 yards, an average of 7.8 yards a return. Junior running back **Ryan Rempe** has five kickoff returns for 190 yards including an 82-yard return for a touchdown at Gettysburg College and four tackles on special teams while freshman running back **Philip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS)** has returned one kickoff for six yards. Freshman wide receiver **Jesse Phillips (Allentown, PA/Salisbury HS)** has added five kickoff returns for 90 yards. Junior running back **Anthony Falco** has seven tackles on special teams and a kickoff return for nine yards while freshman wide receiver **Patrick Meeres (Mount Laurel, NJ/Lenape HS)** has made four tackles. Freshman tight end **Mike Zanoni** has two tackles on special teams as does freshman running back **Zachary Sigley**. Freshman linebacker **Douglas DiMattia (Cedar Grove, NJ/Cedar Grove HS)** has three tackles on special teams and is serving as the team's long snapper on punts.

**STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME:** As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAW The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. In the last game, the defensive line was selected as the player of the game in the Greyhounds' 17-7 win over Ursinus College. The defensive line of seniors **Doug Bocchino** and **Don Maxwell**, sophomores **Michael McClarin** and **Allen Petros** and freshman **Seth Payne** combined for 29 tackles in the victory with five and a half sacks, nine and a half tackles for loss, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

**OVERTIME 'HOUNDS:** Moravian has played a total of eight overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 6-2 all-time in the extra-session. Five of those eight overtime games have been against Juniata College with the Greyhounds going 4-1 in those games. Moravian's contest in Huntingdon marked the first time in the Greyhounds' eight overtime contests that more than one overtime session was needed.

**40s ARE WILD:** Moravian played its first 81 years of football without a contest that saw both teams score more than 40 points. Now, the Greyhounds have done it in back to back seasons. Two weeks ago, Moravian and Gettysburg each scored over 40 points in a 48-41 win by the Bullets. Last season, the Greyhounds and Johns Hopkins University each scored over 40 points in the Greyhounds 44-41 win on September 22, 2007 it was the first time in school history for the feat.
