

FACULTY POSTING: Assistant/ Associate Professor/ Coordinator of Clinical Education of Speech Language Pathology

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The Department of Rehabilitation Sciences in the School of Natural and Health Sciences at Moravian College invites applications for three positions in the brand new Speech-Language Pathology (SLP) Program:

- two full-time, tenure-track, open rank, nine-month positions and
- one twelve-month Coordinator of Clinical Education position

Start dates are negotiable and will fall between July 2018 and July 2019. The SLP program is currently in the process of applying for candidacy through the Council of Academic Accreditation, and will implement a problem-based learning approach to curriculum with a strong interdisciplinary focus.

We are looking for creative, flexible and collaborative individuals who are interested in contributing to program development and creating opportunities for students to engage in influential educational experiences.

Tenure Track Positions (2 openings)

An earned doctorate (PhD preferred) or equivalent research doctorate in speech-language pathology or related area is required. Candidates who are ABD are eligible to apply, and all requirements for the degree must be completed by the appointment date. In addition, applicants must be eligible for the Certificate of Clinical Competence for Speech-Language Pathologists (CCC-SLP).

Job responsibilities include: 1) teaching undergraduate and graduate courses; 2) advising and mentoring students; 3) participating in Departmental initiatives, including curriculum development and service to the Department, College, and professional communities; and, 4) engaging in an active research program in area of interest; which could foster student engagement.

Coordinator of Clinical Education Position

An earned Master's degree in Speech-Language Pathology or a related field is required (earned doctorate preferred). Applicants must hold the Certificate of Clinical Competence for Speech-Language Pathologists (CCC-SLP), be eligible for PA licensure, and have a minimum of three years clinical experience as a Speech-Language Pathologist.

Job responsibilities include: 1) serving as the primary mentor for clinical supervisors; 2) developing clinical education sites; 3) coordinating the clinical education of speech-language pathology students; 4) assisting in curriculum development and implementation; and, 5) teaching undergraduate and graduate courses.

Department, College & Facilities

The Department of Rehabilitation Sciences houses an undergraduate program in Health Sciences (BS) and graduate programs in Athletic Training (MSAT & DAT), Occupational Therapy (MSOT), Speech-Language Pathology (MS-SLP) and Physical Therapy (DPT). The vision for the Department is to develop collaborative, inter-professional programs within a single academic unit. By combining an entrepreneurial spirit and a unique curricular structure, students and faculty are able to engage with one another across disciplines in a truly inter-professional educational environment modeled toward best practices in the clinical setting. Both buildings house cutting-edge technology for student education. Furthermore, Moravian College has developed a partnership with St. Luke's University Health Network, a nonprofit, regional, fully integrated, nationally recognized healthcare system providing services at more than 200 sites across Pennsylvania.
