Visiting Assistant Professor – Computer Science

- Full-time starting in Fall 2016
- Ph.D. in Computer Science or closely related area

Moravian College invites applications for at least one and possibly two full-time, one-year visiting positions to begin Fall 2016. Applicants should hold or be close to completing a Ph.D. in Computer Science or closely related area. The successful candidate will have a broad range of computer science interests, strong interpersonal skills, and a primary commitment to undergraduate teaching in a liberal arts context. Typical teaching responsibilities each semester will be either two courses with associated laboratories or three courses from a broad range of introductory to advanced undergraduate electives.

The computer science program (<http://mathcs.moravian.edu/>) offers both a major and a minor in Computer Science as well as numerous interdisciplinary and individually designed majors. Departmental computing resources include an endowed teaching lab and two computer clusters - one dedicated to teaching and the other to research. Faculty collaborate closely with the campus career center and area industries to offer hands-on learning opportunities in class and through internships and a newly developed co-op program.

- Statement of teaching philosophy
- Summary of research
- Three letters of recommendation – including at least one that addresses teaching
