

Global Leadership: Destinations Unknown

Spring Break (plus fall and spring semester course)

Students will gain leadership skills in a global context as they collectively design their own travel abroad experience. We anticipate that students will gain skills necessary for global leadership, including both theoretical knowledge and practical experience. In the course of planning and creating their own trip, they will become more confident global citizens. They will also gain first-hand knowledge of a specific region of the world. This unique study abroad opportunity includes two courses:

Global Leadership: Theory (1/2 Unit Course in the Fall Semester)

In the fall semester, students will meet regularly to evaluate travel options, discuss readings connected to global leadership, and explore the history and culture of a specific destination in preparation for a spring break visit. Students will take individual responsibility for planning activities and creating opportunities for interaction with natives in the foreign country.

Global Leadership: Practice (1/2 Unit Course in the Spring Semester)

In the spring semester, students will meet to finalize travel plans, create daily itineraries, and confirm meetings at destination. Students will begin to interact with the destination, reviewing the history and culture, along with current events. The travel component will take place during spring break, with two follow-up meetings to discuss and review the course and experience.
