

Sitting in on a college class is a great way to see what life at Moravian is really like. Here's how to prepare and make the most of your visit!

1. Get Ready Like a Pro

- **Dress the part:** Wear comfy shoes and neat, respectful clothing.
- Arrive early: Plan to be at the Visitor Center in Colonial Hall at least 15 minutes before class so we can escort you without interrupting the class.
- Bring the essentials: As an Apple Distinguished school, you'll see our students using iPads and MacBooks for a smoother, digital note-taking experience. Whether you prefer pen and paper or tech, make sure you bring everything you need to make the most of your class visit!

2. During Class—Observe and Absorb

- Introduce yourself (if appropriate): A quick hello and thank-you to the professor can go a long way.
- **Be respectful:** Stay quiet, attentive, and keep your phone silenced.
- **Take notes:** Instead of focusing on the material itself, watch how the professor teaches and how students engage.
- Participate if invited: Some classes are discussionbased, while others may prefer you to observe. Follow the instructor's lead!

3. What to Watch For

- **Teaching Style:** Does the professor use slides, group discussions, or hands-on activities?
- Class Dynamics: Are students engaged? Do they ask questions and participate?
- **Content Delivery:** Does the pace and style of teaching fit your learning preferences?

4. After the Class—Reflect and Follow Up

- Say thank you: If possible, thank the instructor in person before you leave.
- Think it over: Did the class excite you? Could you see yourself learning here?
- Ask questions: If something sparked your interest, reach out to the professor or admissions office to learn more and keep the conversation going.
- Connect with your student ambassador: Ask about their classroom experiences to get a real feel for academics from a student's point of view.

5. Keep the Connection Going

- Send a thank-you note: A short email thanking the instructor for the experience makes a great impression. Be sure to ask for their contact info before leaving class!
- **Stay in touch:** If you're seriously considering Moravian, keep in contact with the admissions office and your counselor for more ways to explore campus life.
