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Goals of the Course:

Student will:

- Create recordings utilizing industry standard recording techniques, including:
 - o using the latest digital sound equipment/hardware.
 - o on Pro Tools recording software.
 - o mixing down and processing raw sound files
 - o using standard industry microphone and signal flow concepts
- Use music performance skills in the pre-production phase of recording by:
 - o developing his/her jazz performance skills.
 - exploring historic jazz styles and eras.
 - o composing and arranging selections for the recording sessions
- Performing in groups:
 - o in large and small ensembles
 - o in live performance
 - in a recording studio

Required Texts:

- Aebersold CD/Book set (provided by the instructor.

Attendance:

- Attendance at all classes and seminars is mandatory. Sessions missed but accompanied by a physician's note will be considered an "excused absence."
- Showing up 10 minutes past the scheduled start of the assigned meeting time will be counted as an unexcused absence.

Grading:

- Student will be graded on:
 - Attendance and class participation (20%)
 - Preparedness of assigned reading, papers and projects (80%)

Assignments:

- Compose a new blues melody using 12 bar blues form 15 points of grade
- Create a recording featuring the student (as featured instrument or of his/her arrangements or composition). 20 points of grade
- Produce practice tracks using music technology (iRealPro, Band-in-a-box, etc.) of F and Bb blues, rhythm changes (in Bb), and ii-V-I in every key (14 different tracks) **10 points of grade**
- Annotated Bibliography of types of software used in the seminars and what each is used for 20 points of grade
- Listening quiz: Identifying landmark artists/recordings 15 points of grade
- A research paper on one of the following topics (students' choice) 20 points of grade:
 - o Microphones and microphone techniques
 - Signal Flow in the Recording Studio
 - o Establishing a Home Recording Studio Digital vs. Analog and the recording Studio
 - Students Choice (with approval of instructor)

Content:

- Assigned pre-readings for the course:
 - o Complete reading chapters 1, 2, & 3 (by the 1st day of the camp)
- Preparation of assigned music/compositions-a new blues
 - Write a blues head for a 12-bar blues (in Bb concert) due the 1st day of the camp
