General Education and Elective Courses

A Moravian College baccalaureate degree requires 32 course units (128 credits) of study. The course units are grouped into general education courses, co-requisite requirements, core business courses, accounting major courses, and general elective courses.

The Comenius general education curriculum of 10 units, required of all bachelor's degree-seeking students, will help you to think critically, obtain knowledge, look at issues from several perspectives, gain understanding and master the skills needed to compete in the economic and cultural climate of the 21st century.

General elective courses round out your liberal arts education. You may take additional accounting courses to fulfill some of the 8 units of general electives required for the baccalaureate degree.

Inform your advisor if you have prior college credits that may transfer to Moravian.
