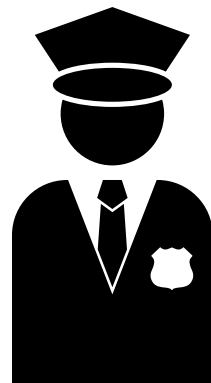

- Able to read, write, memorize, reason, and communicate

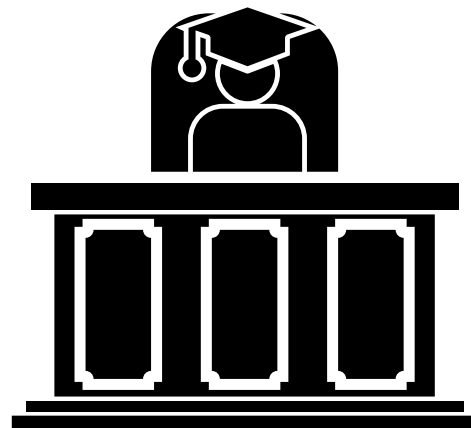
### Sworn Positions

- Dispatcher

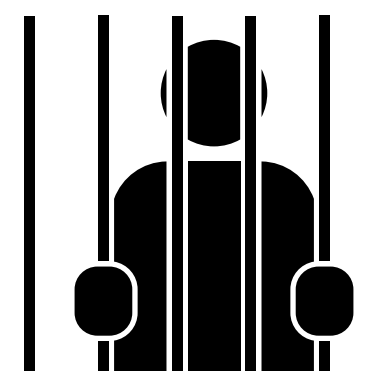

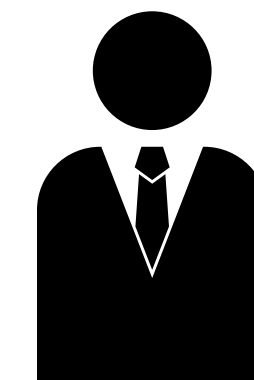

- Physically fit

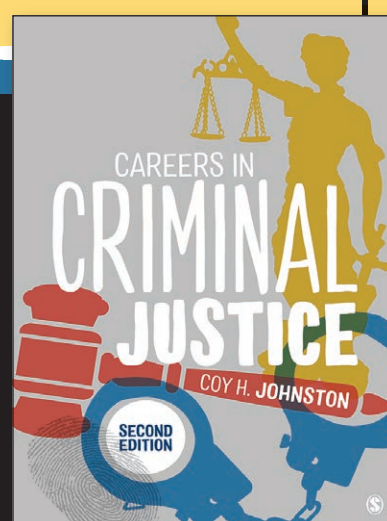
