


Thank You from Our President

Sally Breidegam Miksiewicz Center for Health Sciences

The Sally Breidegam Miksiewicz Center for Health Sciences is a 55,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility for undergraduate and graduate programs. It is used primarily by Nursing and Health Science majors. The center has changed the landscape of the Nursing and Health Science programs by centralizing instructors, students, and learning spaces under one roof. It boasts multiple seminar rooms and simulation labs, five traditional classrooms, and labs in nursing, anatomy and physiology, microbiology, chemistry, and informatics. The center is lovingly named after Sally Breidegam Miksiewicz '84, daughter of DeLight and Helen Breidegam.

Helen S. Breidegam School of Nursing and Public Health

The Helen S. Breidegam School of Nursing and Public Health is housed in the center and is rated the #1 nursing school in Pennsylvania by Nurse.org.

Nursing Simulation & Skills Lab

Flicker Virtual Cadaver Lab

The Flicker Virtual Cadaver Lab is the only virtual cadaver lab in the region featuring a high-tech Anatomage Virtual Dissection Table with two 16"x9" displays positioned end-to-end allowing for critical learning and exploration of the human body. During the global pandemic, this lab provided a seamless way for instructors to teach virtually. In addition, the lab has been a tremendous asset in recruiting the best and brightest future health professionals to Moravian.


