GRADUATE STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEYS

The purpose of graduate student satisfaction surveys is to give students an opportunity to evaluate their program and offer feedback on the curriculum. These surveys allow students to reflect on their experiences in advanced nursing education, including accomplishments, clinical proficiency, and personal growth.

Students in the MSN, MSN-NP, and DNP programs are invited to complete a satisfaction survey at the end of their program of study and again one year after graduation. In addition, the Pennsylvania State Board of Nursing requires that MSN-NP graduates be surveyed again three years post-graduation.

Survey results are summarized by the Graduate Curriculum Evaluation Team (GCET) and shared with nursing faculty. This feedback is essential in helping faculty understand what is working well and where improvements can be made, ensuring the program continues to meet student needs and maintain high standards of academic and clinical excellence.
