

Founding Program Director, Doctor of Physical Therapy Program (Search Extended)

Moravian College invites applications and nominations for the position of **Founding Program Director, Doctor of Physical Therapy Program**. Reporting to The Chair of the Department of Rehabilitation Sciences, the Founding Program Director is responsible for the overall planning, direction and management of the DPT program. The Founding Program Director will be a visionary and experienced leader who will serve as the first Program Director of Moravian's DPT program, currently under development. Working with the Provost, Dean of the School of Natural and Health Sciences and the department chair, the Founding Program Director will lead the development of the Doctor of Physical Therapy program, oversee the CAPTE accreditation process, coordinate daily operations, as well as maintain ongoing collaboration with faculty to cultivate excellence in research, teaching, and service. In doing so, the Founding Program Director will ensure this new program will prosper as an integral part of the Department of Rehabilitation Sciences mission at Moravian College. The Founding Program Director will have teaching responsibilities as well.

The dynamic and growing partnership with St. Luke's University Hospital Health Network (a seven hospital system with over 200 sites) offers exceptional opportunities for clinical collaboration. Moravian College is experiencing significant growth in health profession programs to complement its well-established nursing program, with newly developed public health and athletic training programs, and developing occupational therapy, speech-language pathology and physical therapy programs. A new health science center is under construction and the college has newly renovated the Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation Center in partnership with St. Luke's. Moravian College is committed to preparing students to meet the health care needs of the community.

The ideal candidate will be committed to building an interdisciplinary program in Physical Therapy that will share curricular content with graduate programs in Athletic Training, Occupational Therapy and Speech Pathology, reflecting and resonating with Moravian College's deep and abiding commitment to the liberal arts.

Institution Overview:

Moravian College is a private liberal arts college located in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, in the Lehigh Valley region. The College traces its founding to 1742 by Moravians, descendants of followers of the Bohemian Reformation (John Amos Comenius), the 17th century Moravian bishop. Moravian

College currently enrolls ~1750 full-time undergraduate students in a wide variety of majors, all of which are presented in the liberal arts tradition. Moravian College also offers graduate programs in



business, education, nursing, and athletic training, as well as four graduate degree programs at Moravian Theological Seminary.

HISTORIC BETHLEHEM, PENNSYLVANIA – HOME OF MORAVIAN COLLEGE:

Bethlehem is a constantly-evolving blend of culture and commerce, progress and preservation. The town always has something going on. Guests can enjoy the highly acclaimed, annual Bach Festival. Bagpipe with the best at the Celtic Classic. Enjoy fantastic tunes at the truly epic nine-day Musikfest, which, as one of the largest music festivals in the nation, draws a million visitors each August. Join the more than 5,000 people that descend upon our city for the College's annual Christmas Vespers service in Central Moravian Church in December. 
across all the disciplines within the Department of Rehabilitation Sciences. The successful candidate should meet the following qualifications:
