ANDALUSIA



Andalusia is one of seventeen autonomous communities of Spain, located in the south of Spain. Andalusia is divided into eight regions: Huelva, Seville, Cádiz, Córdoba, Málaga, Jaén, Granada, and Almería. It is the most touristic part of Spain and it is known for its Moorish legacy (711-1492), beaches (Costa del Sol), flamenco music and dancing, bull fighting, and tapas.

CÓRDOBA



Córdoba is the birthplace of the great Roman philosopher Seneca. It is located 1.5 hours west of Granada and has a population of 325,000 inhabitants. Córdoba's history is incredibly rich. In 711, it was captured by the Muslims, and by the 10th century it was the most populous city in all of Europe, with approximately 500,000 inhabitants. During

this time, Córdoba was the most advanced and progressive city in all of Europe. On December 17, 1984, it was declared to be a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Today there are 4 UNESCO sites, more than any city in the world!

GRANADA



Granada sits at the valley of Sierra Nevada, the largest mountain range of Spain and second largest in Europe. It is only one hour away from the beautiful beaches of the south of Spain. In the winter you can ski in the morning and take a walk by the seashore in the afternoon. Granada has a rich Arabic tradition and was the city where Ibn al-Ahmar established the longest lasting Muslim dynasty on the Iberian Peninsula. It is also the home of the Alhambra, constructed by the Moors, which is one of the most magnificent palaces in the world.

SEVILLE



Seville is the capital of Andalusia. Its population is approximately 1.5 million people, making it the 4th largest city in Spain. The old town is 2 square miles and contains 3 UNESCO World Heritage Sites: The Cathedral (above), the Alcazar, and the General Archives of the Indies. Seville is 2,200 years old and has been the site of various civilizations. Most notably, Seville was a Roman city until it was conquered by the Muslims in 712 and then re-conquered by the Christians in 1248.

MÁLAGA



Málaga lies on the southern coast of Spain, on the Mediterranean Sea. With a population

of 500,000, it is a modern cosmopolitan city. It is the birthplace of Pablo Picasso, and it houses the Picasso Museum, which contains a broad array of Picasso's masterpieces. Its history dates back to 2,800 years. The city was founded by the Phoenicians and was later occupied by the Romans, Moors, and in 1487 was conquered by the Spanish Catholic Monarchs. Thus, evidence of these great civilizations can be found throughout the historic part of the city, such as the Alcazaba (11th-century fortress) and the Roman Theater.
