

Her most recent books are *Stairway to Heaven* published by Penguin Poets in 2016, *Death Valley: Painted Light*, a collaboration with photographer/astronomer Stephen Strom published by George F. Thomson and the collection of essays *Zoologies: On Animals and the Human Spirit* which was published by Milkweed Editions in 2014. She has several other books and her work has been published in a number of magazines and other outlets, and she has received a number of other fellowships and awards for her work.

Deming received an MFA from Vermont College. Former Director of the <u>University of Arizona Poetry Center</u> (1990-2002), she currently is Agnese Nelms Haury Chair of Environment and Social Justice and Professor of Creative Writing at the University of Arizona.
